Notice of Public Meeting to Consider the Draft Final Cap-and-Trade Auction Proceeds Fourth Investment Plan

The California Air Resources Board (CARB or Board) will conduct a public meeting at the date and time noted below on the Draft Final Cap-and-Trade Auction Proceeds Fourth Investment Plan.

Background

California Climate Investments is a statewide initiative that puts billions of Cap-and-Trade dollars to work reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, strengthening the economy, and improving public health and the environment particularly in disadvantaged communities, low-income communities, and low-income households. The State's share of Cap-and-Trade auction proceeds are deposited into the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF) for appropriation to California Climate Investments programs, which facilitate greenhouse gas emission reductions and provide a variety of co-benefits.

Since 2013, the Legislature has appropriated over \$16 billion from the GGRF to over 20 State agencies to support a diverse set of California Climate Investments programs that facilitate GHG emission reductions and deliver a variety of co-benefits like improved air quality, energy and transportation cost-savings, ecosystem services (e.g., drought resilience, recreation, biodiversity), and many others. Investments cover virtually every sector of the economy and support a project pipeline that includes research, capacity building, planning, technology demonstration and pilots, and project deployment.

Health and Safety Code section 39716 requires the Department of Finance, in consultation with CARB and other State agencies, to submit a plan to the Legislature

every three years to guide the investment of Cap-and-Trade auction proceeds. The plan must identify the State's GHG reduction goals, analyze gaps in current State GHG emission reduction strategies, identify priority investments, and recommend metrics to measure progress.

The Draft Final Cap-and-Trade Auction Proceeds Fourth Investment Plan (Draft Final Investment Plan or Plan) identifies a suite of future funding priorities for California Climate Investments. The Plan builds on years of implementation of California Climate Investments to identify funding opportunities that support implementation of State climate goals, advance equity and environmental justice, improve public health, support a climate-resilient and prosperous economic future, and foster interagency coordination. Recommendations included in the document do not guarantee funding but rather provide guidance on potential funding opportunities.

The Administration released a *Draft Cap-and-Trade Auction Proceeds Fourth Investment Plan* for public comment in August 2021. The Draft Final Investment Plan incorporates written public comment received on the draft, along with input received at two virtual public workshops.

Proposed Action
