Background

In 2017, in response to Assembly Bill (AB) 617 (C. Garcia, Chapter 136, Statutes of 2017), CARB established the Community Air Protection Program to reduce criteria air pollutants and toxic air contaminant emissions in communities affected by high cumulative exposure burden. The law requires CARB to develop a statewide strategy, known as the Blueprint, to achieve this goal and to do so in consultation with environmental justice organizations, air districts, affected industry, the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment, the Scientific Review Panel on Toxic Air Contaminants, and other interested stakeholders.

CARB adopted its first statewide strategy in September 2018, and adopted its revised strategy, known as Blueprint 2.0, in October 2023. In June 2025, the CARB Board appointed *members and alternates* to the Community Air Protection Consultation Group to broaden representation. Board member Dr. John Balmes was appointed to serve as the Consultation Group Chair. In October 2025, Diane Takvorian, another CARB Board member, was added to further support and lead the group. The purpose of the Consultation Group is to advise CARB on the implementation of Blueprint 2.0 and the Community Air Protection Program. CARB is committed to ensuring that the Consultation Group is supported and operates openly and

transparently. The Consultation Group Charter provides transparency about the advisory body's purpose, role, and the group functions. On March 25, 2026, by unanimous vote, the Consultation Group approved the revised draft Charter to submit for final review and consideration for approval by the CARB Board.

Proposed Action

CARB staff will present the Community Air Protection Consultation Group's revised draft Charter and recommend that the Board consider appointing new primary and alternate members to the Consultation Group at the meeting.
