EXECUTIVE ORDER A-009-1264

New Passenger Cars, Light-Duty Trucks and Medium-Duty Vehicles Page 1 of 3

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Air Resources Board by Health and Safety Code (HSC), Div. 26, Part 5, Chap. 2; and pursuant to the authority vested in the undersigned by HSC Sections 39515 & 39516 and Executive Order G-14-012;

IT IS ORDERED AND RESOLVED:

That the following exhaust and evaporative emission control systems produced by the manufacturer are certified as described below. Production vehicles shall be in all material respects the same as those for which certification is granted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the exhaust and the evaporative emission standards and the certification emission levels for the listed vehicles are as listed on the Attachment. Compliance with the 50° Fahrenheit testing requirement may have been met based on the manufacturer's submitted compliance plan in lieu of testing. Any debit in the manufacturer's "NMOG or NMOG+NOx, as applicable, Fleet Average" (PC or LDT or MDPV) or "Vehicle Equivalent Credit" (MDV) compliance plan shall be equalized as required.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That for the listed vehicle models, the manufacturer has attested to compliance with Title 13, California Code of Regulations, (13 CCR) Sections 1965 [emission control labels], 1968.2 [on-board diagnostic, full or partial compliance], 2035 et seq. [emission control warranty], 2235 [fuel tank fill pipes and openings] (gasoline and alcohol fueled vehicles only), and "High-Altitude Requirements" and "Inspection and Maintenance Emission Standards" (California Exhaust Emission Standards and Test Procedures for 2001 through 2014 Model Criteria Pollutant Exhaust Emission Standards and Test Procedures and 2009 through 2016 Model Greenhouse Gas Exhaust Emission Standards and Test Procedures for Passenger Cars, Light-Duty Trucks, and Medium-Duty Vehicles, amended December 6, 2012 (CA Test Procedures)).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

The test group listed in this Executive Order is certified conditionally on the manufacturer providing data to demonstrate compliance with California's greenhouse gas fleet average emission standard (CA GHG Standard) specified in Title 13, California Code of Regulations, (13 CCR) Section 1961.1 and the incorporated CA Test Procedures. The manufacturer has elected, under 13 CCR Section 1961.1(a)(1)(A)(ii) and under Section E.2.5.1(ii) of the CA Test Procedures, to demonstrate compliance with the CA GHG Standard by demonstrating compliance with the National greenhouse gas program (National GHG Program). Therefore, the test group listed in this Executive Order is certified conditionally further on the manufacturer complying with the requirements specified in said provisions in 13 CCR, and Sections E.2.5.1(ii) and H.4.5(b) and H.4.5(c) of the CA Test Procedures (among other things, concerning data and information submission, timing, and format as specified by the Executive Officer). Failure to comply with the certification requirements to demonstrate compliance with CA GHG Standard by demonstrating compliance with the National GHG Program under said provisions in 13 CCR and CA Test Procedures may be cause for the Executive Officer to revoke the Executive Order. Vehicles in the revoked Executive Order shall be deemed uncertified and subject to penalties authorized under California law. Notwithstanding the requirement herein, a manufacturer that becomes, after MY2009, a large-volume manufacturer, as defined in 13 CCR Section 1900, is not required to comply with the CA GHG Standard until the beginning of the fourth model-year from becoming a large-volume manufacturer. Additionally, notwithstanding the requirement herein, a small-volume manufacturer, independent low-volume manufacturer, or intermediate volume-manufacturer, as defined in 13 CCR Section 1900, is not required to comply with CA GHG Standard during model-years (MY) 2012 through 2015.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

The listed vehicle models are conditionally certified in accordance with 13 CCR Section 1968.2(k) (deficiency and fines provisions for certification of malfunction and diagnostic system) because the on-board diagnostic II (OBD) system of the listed vehicle models has been determined to have eleven deficiencies. The listed vehicle models are approved subject to the manufacturer paying a fine of \$250 per vehicle for the fourth through eleventh deficiencies for vehicles in the listed test group that are produced and delivered for sale in California.

On a quarterly basis, the manufacturer shall submit to the Air Resources Board reports of the number of vehicles produced and delivered for sale in California and pay the full fine owed for that quarter pursuant to this conditional certification. Payment shall be made payable to the State Treasurer for deposit in the Air Pollution Control Fund no later than thirty (30) days after the end of each calendar quarter during the 2014 model-year production period. Failure to pay the quarterly fine, in full, in the time provided, may be cause for the Executive Officer to rescind this conditional certification, effective from the start of the quarter in question, in which case all vehicles covered under this conditional certification for that quarter and all future quarters would be deemed uncertified and subject to a civil penalty of up to \$5000 per vehicle

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

pursuant to HSC Section 43154.

That the listed vehicle models are conditionally certified subject to the following. Within 90 days from the date of this conditional certification, the manufacturer shall obtain approval from the Executive Officer for a modified calibration to detect poor reductant quality and promptly cause vehicle inducement. Approval shall be granted if the modified calibration causes vehicle inducement to occur within the allotted time at an emissions level acceptable to the Executive Officer. Failure to obtain Executive Officer's approval for the modified calibration in the specified time shall be cause for the Executive Officer to revoke the conditional certification ab initio. Vehicles sold under the revoked conditional certification shall be deemed uncertified and subject to a civil penalty of up to \$5000 per vehicle pursuant to HSC Section 43154.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the manufacturer shall maintain a record of vehicles produced and introduced into commerce in California under the conditional Executive Order. The manufacturer shall install on these vehicles, free of any charge to vehicle owners, the approved, modified calibration by October 31, 2015. Any vehicle without the approved, modified calibration shall be reported to ARB by November 30, 2015 for remedial action by the manufacturer under Title 13, California Code of Regulations, Sections 2123 et al.

Vehicles certified under this Executive Order shall conform to all applicable California emission regulations.

The Bureau of Automotive Repair will be notified by copy of this Executive Order.
