OVERVIEW OF AB 617




Focus on Community Action

- Community focused framework
 - Build on existing successful programs
 - Enhanced information on community level air pollution
 - Community specific emission reduction programs
 - Targeted incentive funding
 - Focus on early actions
 - Emphasis on community participation
- Collaborative process involving CARB, air districts, and community representatives

Ongoing Public Engagement

- Comprehensive and collaborative public process involving all stakeholders
- Ongoing opportunities throughout all stages of program development and implementation
- Multiple forums for technical and policy discussion

COMMUNITY IDENTIFICATION



Identifying Communities

- Prioritize communities with highest exposure burdens:
 - Deployment of community air monitoring
 - Development of community emission reduction programs
- Focus on disadvantaged communities and sensitive receptor locations

- What represents a "community"?
- Do the communities identified for air monitoring need to be the same as those for reduction programs?
- What type of process should be used to select communities?






STATEWIDE MONITORING PLAN & COMMUNITY AIR MONITORING



Statewide Plan for Community Air Monitoring





Community Air Monitoring

- Deploy community air monitoring networks in identified communities (by July 2019)
- District and community led activities
- Builds on existing programs
- Develop tools for enhanced accessibility of air quality data


- What lessons have been learned from current community air monitoring activities?

STATEWIDE STRATEGY & COMMUNITY EMISSION REDUCTION PROGRAMS




Statewide Strategy for Community Emissions Reductions

INCENTIVE AND GRANT FUNDING



Funding

- \$250M for incentive programs to support early actions to reduce mobile source emissions
 - 43% to South Coast Air Quality Management District
 - 32% to San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District
 - 20% to Bay Area Air Quality Management District
 - 5% to CARB for redistribution to other Air Districts
- \$5M for community assistance grants
 - Training/support
 - Technical experts




ADDITIONAL ELEMENTS



Additional AB 617 Requirements

- Expedited schedule for implementation of Best Available Retrofit Control Technology on large industrial sources
- Technology clearinghouse
- Statewide annual emissions reporting system
- Enhanced penalty provisions

The goal of AB 617 is to ensure that everyone benefits from our state's air quality efforts, especially those that live in the most severely pollution impacted areas of California. AB617 provides for:

- Community level monitoring
- Statewide strategy to reduce emissions impacting communities
- Community-specific emission reduction plans
- Accelerated retrofit of pollution control equipment at existing facilities near communities
- Direct reporting of emissions to the CARB
- Increased penalties
