

### FORM 53 – Portable Equipment Unit Daily Recordkeeping Form

*This form must be kept at a central place of business. It must be maintained for five years and made accessible to the California Air Resources Board Executive Officer or Local Air Districts upon request.*

Form 53 Instructions

1. **Company Name** - Legal name of entity, business, organization, agency or private individual that operates the registered portable engine.
2. **PERP Registration Number** - Enter the registration number from the registration certificate or sticker.
3. **Company Unit ID** – Enter the Company Unit ID that can be cross referenced with the engine registration number.
4. **Location** – Enter the location using street address and city; county and UTM coordinates; or other location indicator where the equipment unit operated or was located on the date indicated. The location should be entered for daily operation and also each time the equipment unit is brought to a new location.

6. **Date** – Enter the date (month, day, and year) the location was recorded.
7. **Amount of Material Processed** – Enter the quantity of material processed. Use the units as listed in the Operating Conditions for the equipment unit or the units listed below for the type of equipment.

Portable Concrete Batch Plant	Yards of finished concrete produced

Portable Slurry Mixer, Storage Silo	Cubic yards of material
Portable Rock Drills	Feet drilled
