Form 55 Instructions

General: Submit a separate form for each PERP-registered engine. Submit this form by March 1st of each year for the previous year's operation. This form is for reporting the hours of operation for low-use engines, not equipment units. Use Form 54 for reporting the amount of material processed in each air district where an equipment unit operated.

1. *Company Name* - Legal name of entity, business, organization, agency or private individual that operates the registered portable engine.
2. *PERP Registration Number* - Enter the registration number from the registration certificate or sticker.
3. *Reporting Year* – Enter the year for which the engine operation is being reported.
4. *Hour Meter Readings*

Initial Reading - Enter the engine hour meter reading taken at the beginning of the year and include the date.

Ending Reading – Enter the engine hour meter reading taken at the end of the year and include the date.

5. *Total Annual Usage* – Provide the total hours of operation of the low-use engine for the year. (hour reading from the end of the year – hour reading from the beginning of the year = total annual hours of operation)

6. – 7. Enter the name and phone number of the Responsible Party. The form must be signed.

Please note that under the California Public Records Act (Gov. Code, § 6250 et seq.), your submissions, including associated contact information (e.g., your address, phone, email, etc.) become public records and may be released to the public upon request. Personal information will be protected from disclosure as required by law, including under the Information Protection Act. (Cal. Civ. Code, § 1798, et seq.)
