Concepts

CARB is in the process of evaluating each concept presented to develop the fee. Currently, CARB staff are focusing on the "Application Fee Concept" as the best fit for most EO series, with the caveats presented at the workshops. Please provide comments on this strategy or provide alternatives for CARB to evaluate. Please provide business information or other data to support your alternative strategy.

Business Information

CARB is conducting a formal economic review process called "Standardized Regulatory Impact Assessment" or SRIA and needs business information outlined on the SRIA titled slides. The "small business" definition used for the SRIA can be found in Government Code section 11346.3, subdivision (b)(4)(B) which states: (B) For the exclusive purpose of undertaking the economic impact assessment, a "small business" means a business that is all of the following:

- (i) Independently owned and operated.
- (ii) Not dominant in its field of operation.
- (iii) Has fewer than 100 employees.
