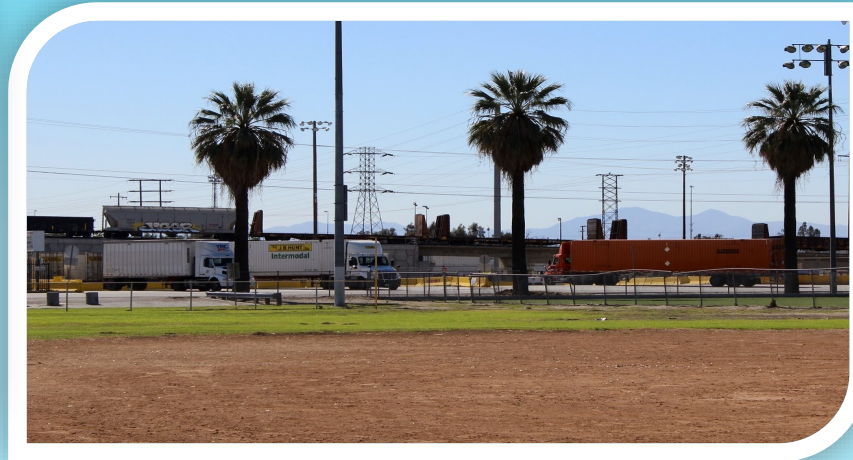
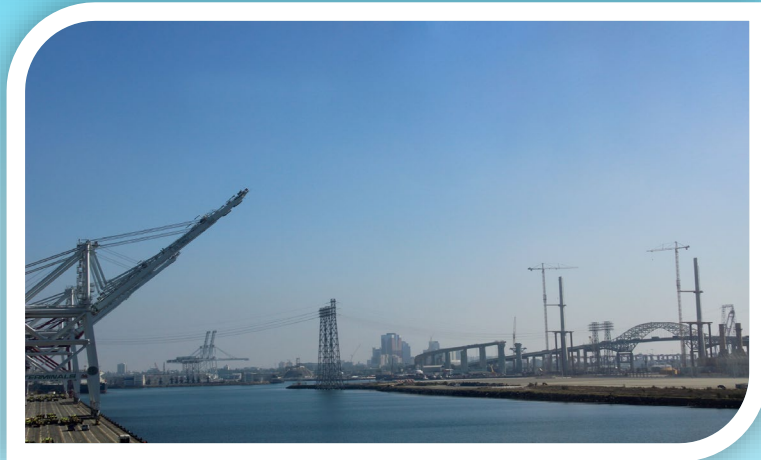
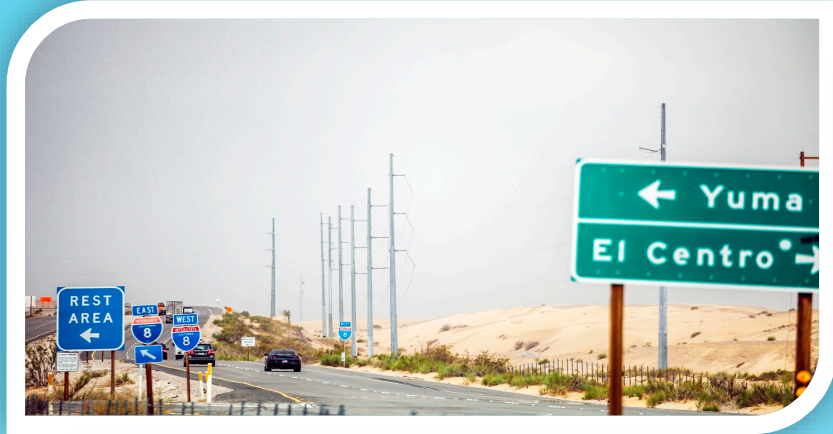
2018

2019

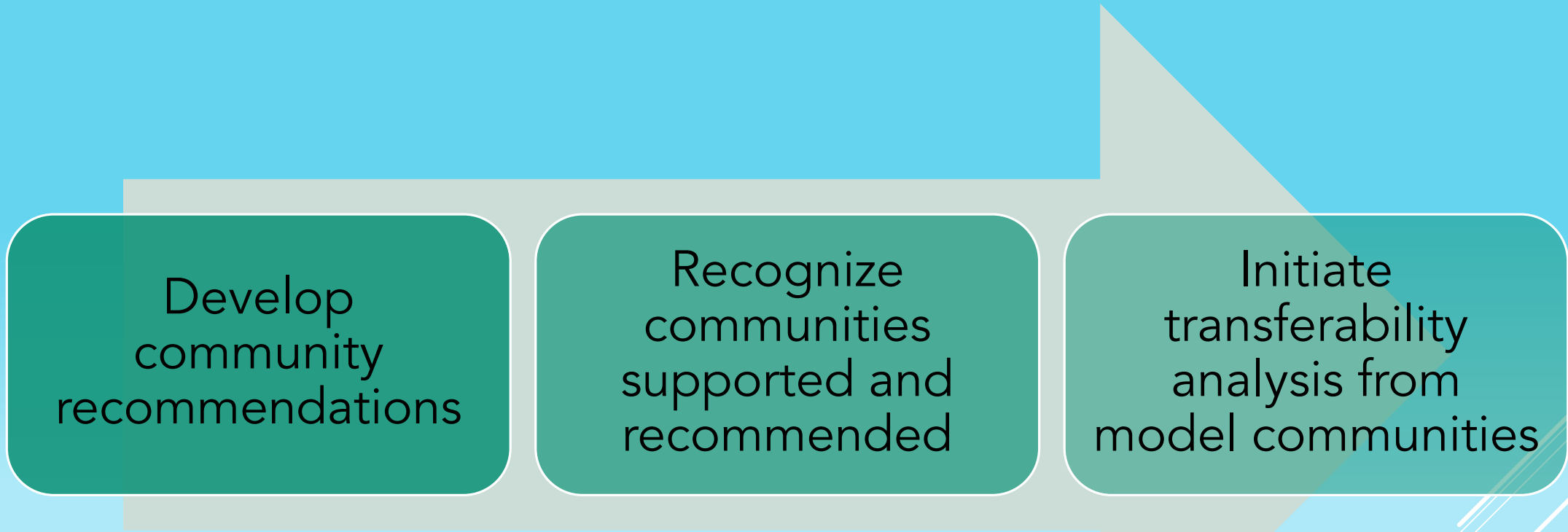
- 3 new communities

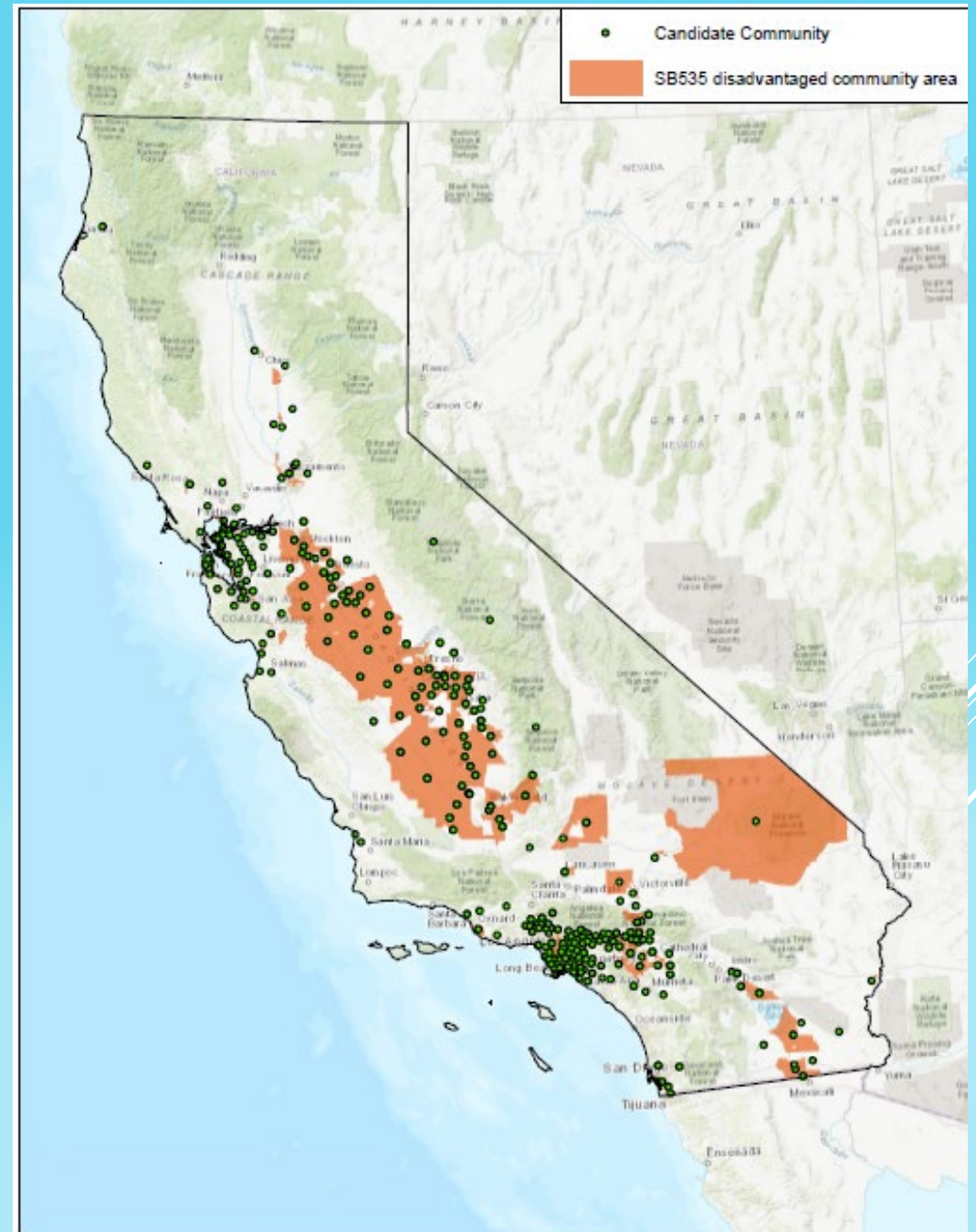

INITIATE TRANSFERABILITY ANALYSIS

- Recognize the abundant need – hundreds of impacted communities in California
- Existing communities recommended based on potential to transfer:
 - Best practices,
 - Strategies, or
 - Other element developed
- Leverage lessons learned in existing communities
- Discussions with AB 617 Consultation Group, environmental justice groups, and air districts

2020 TIMELINE
