## ANNUAL COMMUNITY CONSIDERATION

CARB Governing Board annually considers selection of communities for either community emissions reduction programs, community air monitoring plans, or both.



## COMMUNITIES SELECTED STATEWIDE



#### 2018

- Initial 10 communities
- 7 communities developed community emissions reduction programs
- 9 communities developed community-level air quality monitoring plans

- 3 new communities
- 1 community transitioned from a monitoring plan to a community emissions reduction program



- Budget, anticipate a very limited number of communities




### BUILDING A COMMUNITY LIST
