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AB 2588 Reassessments

- In 2015, the State Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) revised its Risk Assessment Guidelines to provide enhanced protection of children and the public overall
- The District then updated its health risk assessment processes and policies to incorporate the health-protective changes
- District developed a facility health risk reassessment plan based on the original legislation's multi-year prescription

District's Health Protective Approach

- Implemented all OEHHA changes that increase calculated risk
 - Provides maximum protection of children
- Did not implement those changes that were not as conservative as current District policy
 - Use 95% breathing rate for adults and children
 - Use 70-year residential exposure
 - Use 40-year worker exposure
 - No spatial averaging

Implementation Plan

 District facility health risk reassessment plan based on the original legislation's multi-year prescription of actual/potential emissions (NOx, SOx, TOG, PM)

Phase 1	Emissions \geq 25 tons	
Phase 2	10 <u><</u> Emissions < 25 tons	
Phase 3	EIC&GR <i>App. E</i> facilities with emissions < 10 tons, excluding industrywide	
Phase 4	Industrywide, diesel only, and ag facilities	

 Current intermediate level facilities will be reassessed on their quadrennial update year
