The California Air Resources Board (CARB) invites you to participate in a virtual public workshop to discuss the Draft In-Use Locomotive Regulation. CARB staff previously held public workshops in November-December 2019 and October 2020 to discuss the draft concepts. The purpose of this workshop is to present and discuss draft regulatory language, and preliminary cost numbers and assumptions being used to develop the Standardized Regulatory Impact Assessment (SRIA). This workshop solicits early, informal public review and input on the language and data that will be considered in the development of the In-Use Locomotive Regulation.

Draft regulatory language and preliminary cost information have been posted on the *Reducing Rail Emissions in California* webpage. Reducing Emissions from In-Use Locomotives

CARB is developing the In-Use Locomotive Regulation to accelerate the adoption of advanced, cleaner technologies, including zero-emission technologies, for locomotive operations. This draft regulation would be implemented statewide, and provide an opportunity for railroads to better address regional pollution and long-standing environmental justice concerns with communities near railyards.

Additionally, the draft regulation includes a pathway to accelerate the immediate adoption of advanced cleaner technologies for all locomotive operations. These accelerated timelines for cleaner technologies are in response to *Executive Order N-79-20*, which calls for 100 percent of off-road vehicles and equipment operations to be zero-emission by 2035.
