The purpose of this workshop is to update stakeholders on the proposed methodology and data that will be used to develop RMV2022 model. Background

Recreational marine vessels (RMV) are significant contributors to reactive organic gas (ROG) and Oxides of Nitrogen (NO_x) emissions in California, and reducing emissions from this

sector would be essential for meeting the federal and state ambient air quality standards. The emissions inventory is an important tool for policymakers to assess the emissions impact of the sector and the potential emissions reductions that can be achieved through various policies. It is critical to update the emissions inventory on a regular basis so that it would reflect the latest available information on engine technology, annual sales, or usage activity. CARB is developing a new emission inventory for recreational marine vessels to reflect updated activity, emission factors, and population. The new RMV2022 model will inform various emission reduction strategies that CARB is exploring to reduce emissions from this sector.
