The Grant is being utilized to update two rules in order to meet the expedited BARCT requirements for the facilities identified under AB 617. The District has also acquired two new multi-pollutant AQ mesh community air monitors to place in remote communities of Tehama County. The District is also currently Developing the website tehcoapcd.net/cap to serve as our outreach center for District activities related to AB 617. The District has also reviewed its complaint and permit database to identify community sources of concern in order to direct AB 617 efforts to those most burdened in Tehama County.

Completed the purchase and installation of new community air monitoring stations. Development of the Tehama County Air Pollution Control District CAP website to provide outreach to the public on efforts related to 617 implementation and incentives. Review of complaints and permit databases to identify sources of concern for community emissions reduction programs. Operation of Community air monitoring sites. Implementation of expedited BARCT schedule.
