1. Continuation of the Panel's discussion of its draft findings based on the report, "Sulfuryl Fluoride (Vikane[®]) Risk Characterization Document," June 2005 (revised June 2006).

The Panel will continue the discussion of its findings for the fumigant sulfuryl fluoride based on its review of the Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR) report proposing that sulfuryl fluoride be identified as a toxic air contaminant. If adopted, the findings will be submitted to the DPR Director under Food and Agricultural Code section 14023. http://www.cdpr.ca.gov/docs/empm/pubs/tac/draftrcd.htm

2. Review of the draft report, "Methidathion (Supracide[®]) Risk Characterization Document," June 2006.

The Panel will review a draft report prepared by DPR proposing to identify methidathion as a toxic air contaminant. Methidathion is an organophosphate pesticide used in a wide variety of crops. 3. Briefing on the Apodaca et al. v. California Air Resources Board et al. court decision.

The Panel will be briefed on the court decision earlier this year upholding the identification of particulate matter from diesel-fueled engines as a toxic air contaminant. (Superior Court of California, County of Fresno, Case No. 00CECG10832).

4. Briefing on the Department of Pesticide Regulation's new air quality initiative.

On May 30th, DPR announced a new comprehensive pesticide initiative that focuses on four areas: reducing emissions from fumigants; reformulating products to reduce emissions and risks; promoting new, more environmentally-friendly technologies; and developing strategic pest management partnerships in cooperation with industry. DPR staff will provide an overview of the new initiative.

5. Consideration of administrative matters.

The Panel may discuss various administrative matters and scheduling of future meetings.

INFORMATION ABOUT THE SCIENTIFIC REVIEW PANEL

The Scientific Review Panel (Panel) is charged with evaluating the risk assessments of substances proposed for identification as toxic air contaminants by the Air Resources Board (ARB), the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) and the Department of Pesticide Regulation (DPR), and the review of guidelines prepared by OEHHA. In carrying out this responsibility, the Panel reviews the exposure and health assessment reports and underlying scientific data on which the reports are based, which are prepared by the ARB, DPR, and OEHHA pursuant to Health and Safety Code sections 39660-39661, 39669.5 and 44360, and Food and Agricultural Code sections 14022-14023. These reports are prepared for the purpose of determining whether a substance or pesticide should be identified as a toxic air contaminant, or as guidelines to be used in preparing health risk assessments.

The Panel welcomes written comments or submissions from all parties regarding a report. To assure adequate review, the Panel does not accept oral comments from the public at its meetings, and requests that information submitted for its consideration be sent to the Panel Liaison (contact information below) no later than two weeks prior to the meeting. These submissions are received and carefully reviewed and considered by the Panel members prior to the public meeting.
