

Notice of Public Workshop on Updates to Ocean-Going Vessels and Cargo Handling Equipment Emissions Inventories

The California Air Resources Board (CARB or Board) staff invites you to participate in a public workshop on Wednesday, September 22, 2021 to discuss updates to the California Ocean-Going Vessels (OGV) and Cargo Handling Equipment (CHE) emissions inventories. The purpose of this workshop is to update stakeholders on the methodology and data that are used to develop the inventories, and present the resulting emissions both at California ports and railyards, and also out to 100 nautical miles from the coast for OGV.

Background

The OGV sector is a critical component of California's economy, and expected to be one of the largest emissions sources in the near future. The new emissions inventory is an update to the data sources, methodology, activity, emissions rates, and resulting emissions from ocean-going vessels. The updated OGV inventory was developed using data from the most recent Automatic Identification System (AIS) transponder records in 2020, emissions factors from the recent U.S. EPA emissions inventory, proposed engine loads from the Vessel Boarding Program at the Ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach, vessel registry information from 2020 IHS records, 2019 CARB At-Berth Compliance reporting, and a few more sources. The updated inventory captures the many years of collective efforts from many agencies including regulatory and incentive programs that have helped achieve lower emissions, cleaner engines and fuels, and vessel speed reduction zones since 2014.

Cargo Handling Equipment is used both in ports and rail yards to facilitate the movement of containers. The new emissions inventory is an update to the activity and emissions rates from these ports and rail yards. New updates include additional fuel types, including gasoline, propane and electric equipment in the inventory. The updated CHE inventory was developed using information embedded in the most recent emission inventories from Port of Los Angeles, Port of Long Beach, and Port of Oakland. Data for smaller ports and railyards was obtained from CARB's reporting data.
