EJAC Comments

Fuel Industry
<i>"CARB should" is implied at the start of every comment listed in the table below.</i>
Share what is different that we've learned from previous plans to advance Environmental Justice from the lens of the fuel industry, not just policies but methodology, but inputs that E3 is doing, how is that any different from previous Scoping Plan if any.
Disclose the direction provided internally at CARB on the Scoping Plan. How each Scoping Plan team's work fits into the Scoping Plan. Share difference from Scoping Plan, EJ general difference, and what each Scoping Plan team is preparing based on model outputs.
Embed SCS into Scoping Plan.
Mandate certain targets for MPOs & when targets aren't met, reveal why & double down on mandates.
Aim for environmental justice.
Disclose the types of tools are you using to analyze development tools.
Be ambitious in the transportation sector & do not rely on unproven technologies like CCUS.
Discuss Caltrans numbers, which are likely conservative.
Describe differences between regulations at the Mexico – California Border compared to ports such as Long Beach.
Detail how Border emissions are calculated, counted & integrated into Scoping Plan.
Invest in mass transit.
Consider people without vehicles, jobs, etc. in modeling outputs.
