2022 Scoping Plan Schedule

- Early May 2022: Draft Scoping Plan released
- June 23 – 24, 2022: Board Meeting on Draft Scoping Plan
- Summer 2022: Refine Draft Scoping Plan
 - Ongoing modeling and stakeholder process
 - Ongoing engagement with the EJ Advisory Committee

2022 Scoping Plan Schedule

- September 1, 2022: Joint EJAC CARB Board Meeting
- Fall 2022: Release final Scoping Plan
- Late Fall 2022: Board vote on the final Scoping Plan

EJAC Community and Tribal Engagement Process

- CARB meets weekly with EJAC Community Engagement workgroup to provide support for EJAC Community Engagement.
- As a part of this workgroup, CARB is also working closely with the tribal representative to provide logistics and funding to support tribal outreach.

EJAC Community and Tribal Engagement Process

1. Submit proposals to Ambreen Afshan at least 3 weeks in advance.
2. Ambreen will work directly with EJAC members on the proposal.
3. Once proposals are finalized, CARB will process proposals and develop contracts with each organization conducting community engagement.

EJAC Community and Tribal Engagement Process

- For community and tribal engagement contracts:
 - Contract amount per organization must be under 10K
 - Work cannot start until the contract is fully executed
 - Scope of Work must include task, timelines and corresponding budget
 - All templates provided by CARB on EJAC Resources website

EJAC Permanence

- Currently, CARB administers the following activities:
 - EJAC meetings which may include joint meetings with CARB Board, agenda co-development, facilitation, scheduling and logistics
 - Communication with the EJAC, including EJAC compensation and travel arrangements
 - Funding support for community and Tribal engagement, including bilingual services, etc.
 - EJAC Workgroup meeting logistics

EJAC Permanence

- Per the Chair's direction regarding a permanent EJAC:
 - The EJAC could advise CARB Board on pertinent AB 32 implementation activities, including AB 32 program(s) or regulation(s).
 - CARB staff could provide technical support and assistance to the EJAC by bringing in CARB subject matter experts on AB 32 related topics.

EJAC Permanence

- Ongoing CARB staff resources and contract funds will be required to support a permanent EJAC.
- Will require budget allocation to ensure CARB and EJAC has the necessary resources to explore a permanent EJAC.
