

AB 617 Budget FY 2022-23

Total of \$300M for AB 617

Budget Act of 2022: SB154 and AB178

- CAP Incentives \$200M GGRF; \$40 M APCF
- AB 617 Implementation \$50 M GGRF
- Community Air Grants \$10 M GGRF

Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF); Air Pollution Control Fund (APCF).

Note: Implementation and CAP Incentives funds allocations for air districts are expected in Spring 2023.

People's Blueprint Chapter 9: Participatory Budgeting and Funding

- The PBP recommends participatory budgeting for AB 617 fund allocation.
- The PBP describes participatory budgeting within the AB 617
 Program as being "built by the CSC in partnership with air district staff prior to final approval by the air district board" and as "return[ing] power back to residents" (pg. 47)





People's Blueprint Chapter 9: Participatory Budgeting and Funding

- Recommends guiding principles for participatory budgeting in the AB 617 Program (pg. 47)
- Suggests "each CSC must have the autonomy to determine the structure of their budgeting process." (pg. 48).
- Recommends building in time needed to make participatory budgeting decisions (pg. 48)



People's Blueprint Chapter 9: Participatory Budgeting and Funding

The PBP shares two illustrative examples of <u>participatory</u> budgeting models (pg. 48-50):

- 1. "Community-level budgeting" and
- 2. "Region-level participatory budgeting"


