- Update required every 5 years (Sept 2023)
- Incorporate lessons learned over the last 5 years
- Reimagine the Program *together* to identify new ways to support more communities

- Improve relationships with Tribes concerned about air quality and air pollution impacting their communities and members

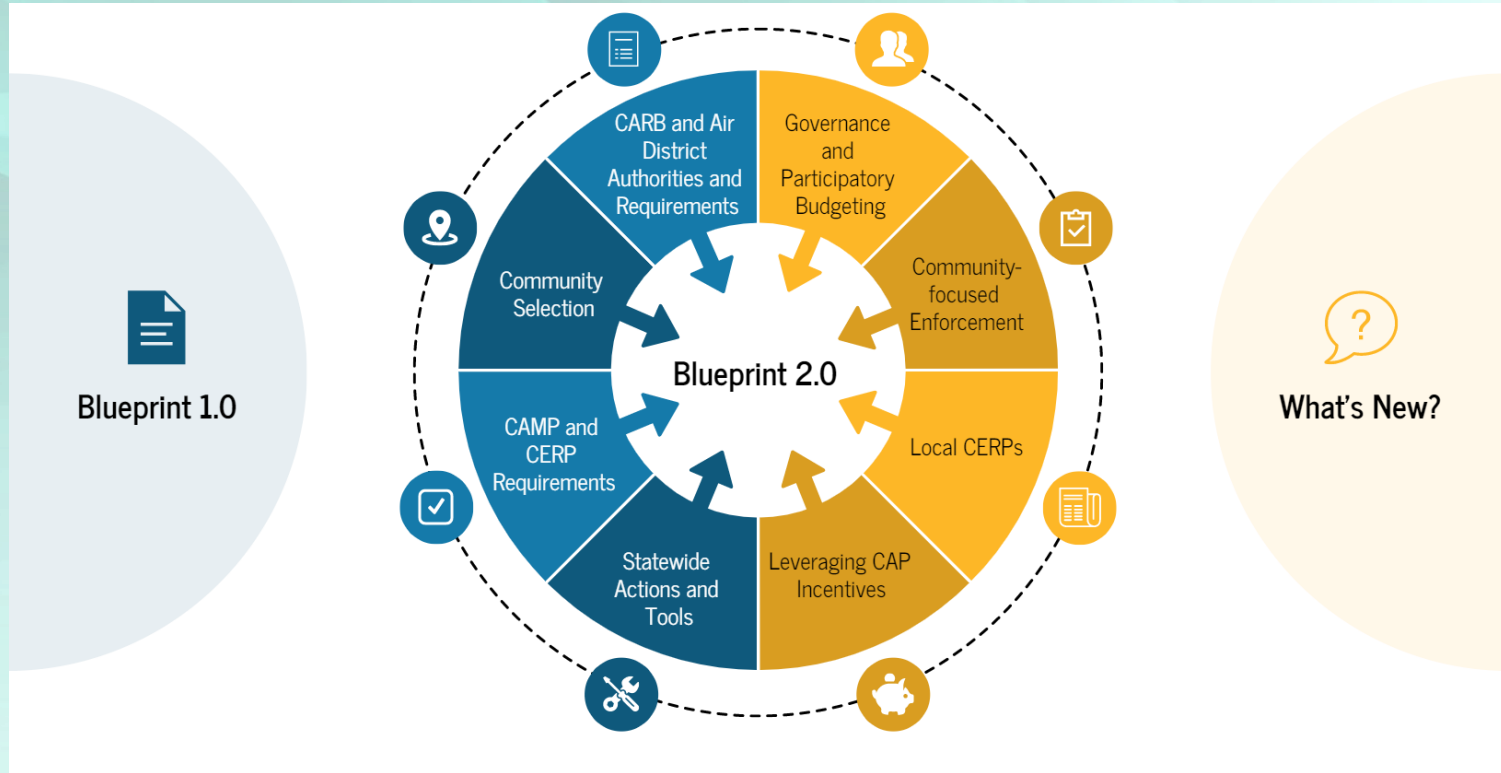

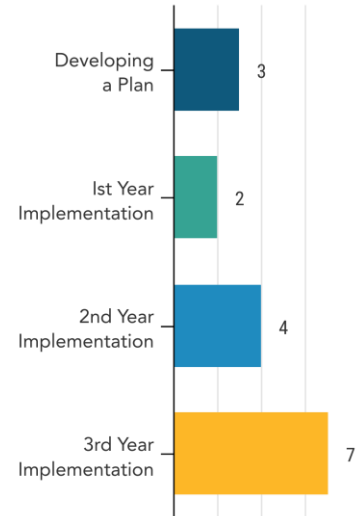

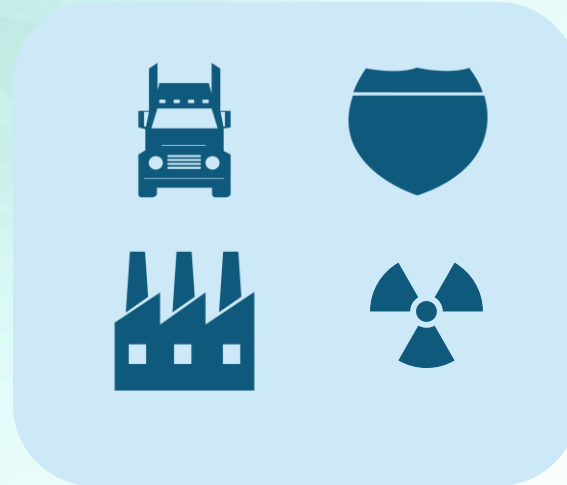

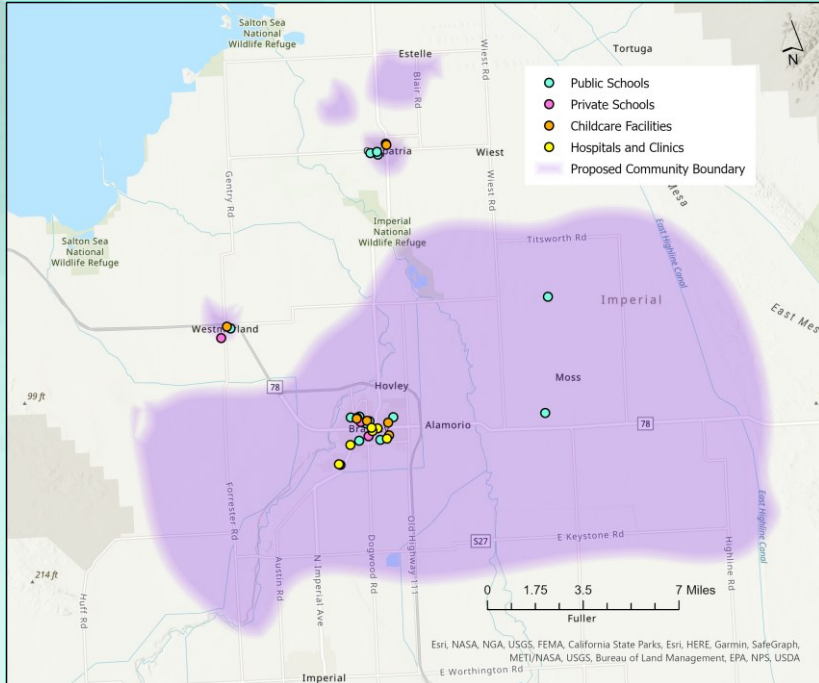
