# 1. FY 2023-24 AB 617 Program Proposed Budget (<u>SB 101</u> and <u>AB 102</u>)

- On June 15, 2023, SB 101 passed the Senate and Assembly and on June 27, 2023, AB 102 passed the Senate and Assembly.
  - The \$300M AB 617 Program Proposed funding remains the same, but the funds from each pot are now a combination of General Fund and Greenhouse Gas Reduction Funding.
- June 30, 2023- Anticipated that the Governor will sign the Budget.

#### 2. New Tools

- A. <u>Draft Workbook of CERP Strategies and Actions</u> A spreadsheet-based Excel workbook that provides a summary of strategies identified in Community Emissions Reduction Programs (CERPs) from communities selected for the Community Air Protection program.
  - Data is organized across four color-coded worksheets where each provide a higher level of detail.
  - Explore the actions associated with each strategy

## B. Air Quality Fundamentals Video Series

 CARB, with the support of California Air Pollution Control Officers Association (CAPCOA), developed a video series on Air Quality Fundamentals to provide an introduction to air pollution control and greenhouse gas emissions reduction in California.

- In February 2023, the first three videos were made available and included a Series Overview, Emission Types, and Health Effects of Air Pollution.
- In early 2024, additional videos will be available covering topics such as:
  - 1. Where do emissions come from?
  - 2. How are air pollutant and greenhouse gas emissions measured, tracked, and controlled?
  - 3. Standards for safe air quality.
  - 4. How can you help make your community's air cleaner.

# C. Mapping tool for 65-plus places (in development)

- The <u>Consistently Nominated AB 617 Communities list</u> is built from air district and community-based organization (CBO) recommendations and community self-nominations since 2018, the first year of the Program.
- In July 2022, for the fifth year of the Program, CARB staff provided the air districts with a copy of the list for confirmation or adjustments.
- The Consistently Nominated Communities draft mapping tool builds from the air district, community-based organizations, and community nominations since 2018, the first year of the Program, and provides location of approximately 65 areas, or consistently nominated communities.
- CARB recognizes resources beyond the AB 617 program may be available to support these communities through many other programs/grants, etc. CARB often receives requests for communities that have been prioritized for assistance.
- Expected later this summer, this draft mapping tool can serve as a starting point for programs beyond AB 617 to identify communities across California and start engaging with them and associated air district to provide resources to help improve their air quality.
