Advanced Clean Fleets (ACF) Regulation

ACF Background

- Adopted by Board April 28, 2023
- Approved by Office of Administrative Law October 1, 2023
- Transitions fleets to zero emissions vehicles (ZEVs) over the course of the upcoming decades and guarantees a vehicle's full useful life
- Affects
 - Vehicles with a gross vehicle weight rating >8,500 pounds, and
 - Off-road yard tractors, and
 - Light-duty mail and package delivery vehicles
- Applies to
 - Drayage fleets,
 - State and local government fleets, and
 - Fleets that have either \$50 million or more in gross annual revenue, or own, operate, or have common ownership or control of a total of 50 or more vehicles



Purpose of TRIG

- Successful implementation of the ACF Regulation as written
- Facilitate constructive dialogue to address rule implementation challenges
- Create and foster relationships between affected parties
- Develop recommendations and action items on key issues



Member Expectations

- Attend all meetings or have representative attend

Member Roles
