#### SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

This Settlement Agreement is entered into between the California Air Resources Board (CARB), with its principal location at 1001 I Street, Sacramento, California 95814; and Raza Enterprises, doing business as Expo Furniture Gallery (Expo Furniture), with its principal location at 7310 Home Leisure Plaza, Sacramento, California 95823 (collectively, the "Parties," or individually, "Party").

#### **LEGAL BACKGROUND**

- (1) <u>Purpose</u>. The California Health and Safety Code mandates the reduction of the emission of toxic air contaminants (TAC). CARB has determined that formaldehyde emissions from composite wood products is a TAC. (Health & Saf. Code §§ 39650, et seq.)
- (2) <u>Regulation</u>. CARB adopted the Airborne Toxic Control Measure to Reduce Formaldehyde Emissions from Composite Wood Products (Composite Wood Regulation) to reduce formaldehyde emissions from composite wood in the State of California. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 17, § 93120-93120.12.)
- (3) Regulatory Provisions. All manufacturers, distributors, importers, fabricators, third-party certifiers, and retailers of composite wood products (hardwood plywood, particleboard, and medium density fiberboard) and finished goods, who sell, offer for sale, supply, use, or manufacture for sale in California must comply with and take reasonably prudent precautions to ensure composite wood products and finished products comply with formaldehyde emissions limits set out in the Composite Wood Regulation. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 17, § 93120 et seq.)
- (4) Penalty Provisions. Failure to comply with the regulatory requirements is a violation of state law that may result in penalties up to eleven thousand seven hundred ten dollars (\$11,710.00 USD) for strict liability violations; respectively, for each day in which the violation occurs. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 17, § 93120, et seq.; Health & Saf. Code §§ 39674, 39675, 42400, et seq., 42402, et seq., and 42410.)

#### CASE BACKGROUND

- (5) <u>Corporate Entity</u>. At all relevant times, Expo Furniture was the fictious business name owned by California corporation Raza Enterprises and conducted business in the State of California.
- (6) Allegations. CARB alleges Expo Furniture violated the Composite Wood Regulation by selling, or offering for sale between July 12, 2021, and June 8, 2023, composite wood products without taking reasonable prudent precautions, as outlined in NOVCW23-05-02. "Reasonable prudent precautions" include, at a minimum, instructing each supplier that the goods they supply to the retailer must comply with the applicable emission standards, and obtaining written documentation from each supplier that this is so. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 17,

- § 93120.8(b).) CARB alleges that if paragraphs 1 through 6 were proven, civil penalties could be imposed against Expo Furniture for each and every product involved in the violations and each day.
- (7) <u>Acknowledgment</u>. Expo Furniture admits to the facts in paragraphs 1 through 6, but denies any liability resulting from said allegations.
- (8) <u>Consideration</u>. In consideration of the foregoing, and of the promises and facts set forth herein, the Parties desire to settle and resolve all claims, disputes, and obligations relating to the above-listed alleged violations and voluntarily agree to resolve this matter by means of this Settlement Agreement. In order to resolve the violations described herein, Expo Furniture has taken, or agrees to take, the actions enumerated below within the Terms and Conditions. Further, CARB accepts this Settlement Agreement in termination and full settlement of this matter.

#### **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

In consideration of CARB not filing a legal action against Expo Furniture for the alleged violations referred to above in the Legal Background and Case Background, and Expo Furniture's agreement to complete all terms and conditions set forth below, CARB and Expo Furniture agree as follows:

- (9) <u>Settlement Amount</u>. Expo Furniture shall pay a civil penalty of six thousand dollars (\$6,000.00 USD). Expo Furniture shall make all payments in accordance with the payment schedule in Paragraph 10 (Payment Plan and Schedule).
- (10) <u>Payment Plan and Schedule</u>. Pursuant to this Settlement Agreement, Expo Furniture shall make payments below. First payment shall be due within sixty (60) calendar days from the date CARB notifies Expo Furniture of full execution of the Settlement Agreement.

(11) <u>Civil Penalty Payment Method</u>. Expo Furniture shall pay the civil penalty by check, credit card, wire transfer, or portal, payable to the "California Air Resources Board," using instructions provided separately by CARB in a Payment Transmittal Form. Expo Furniture is responsible for all payment processing fees. Payments

shall be accompanied by the Payment Transmittal Form to ensure proper application. At the time payment is made, Expo Furniture shall provide CARB with proof of payment, including a copy of the Payment Transmittal Form, to the email address provided in Paragraph 14 (Notices). CARB shall deposit the civil penalty amount into the Air Pollution Control Fund for the purpose of carrying out CARB's duties and functions to ensure the integrity of its air pollution control programs. Should payment instructions change, CARB will provide notice to Expo Furniture in accordance with Paragraph 14 (Notices).

- (12) <u>Acceleration</u>. If any payment is more than thirty (30) calendar days late from the payment schedule deadline, the entire remaining balance is accelerated to become due and payable immediately without notice or demand.
- (13) <u>Documents</u>. Expo Furniture shall promptly email or mail the signed and dated Settlement Agreement, to the address or email listed in Paragraph 14 (Notices). Alternatively, Expo Furniture may email the signed and dated Settlement Agreement directly to the CARB Enforcement Division Investigator handling the Settlement.
- (14) <u>Notices</u>. Unless otherwise specified in this Settlement Agreement, whenever notifications, submissions, or communications are required by this Settlement Agreement, they shall be submitted in writing to the address or email below:

Any Party may, by written notice to the other Parties, change its designated notice recipient or notice address provided above. Notices submitted pursuant to this section shall be deemed submitted upon emailing or mailing.

(15) <u>Repeat Violations</u>. Expo Furniture agrees to comply with all regulatory requirements and acknowledges that repeat violations could result in increased penalties in the future.

- (16) Entirety. This Settlement Agreement constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the Parties concerning the Case Background and supersedes and replaces any and all prior negotiations and agreements of any kind, whether written or oral, between the Parties concerning the Case Background hereof. This Settlement Agreement consists of 8 pages and 33 paragraphs.
- (17) <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Settlement Agreement binds Expo Furniture, and any principals, officers, receivers, trustees, successors and assignees, subsidiary and parent corporations and CARB and any successor agency that may have responsibility for and jurisdiction over the subject matter of this Settlement Agreement.
- (18) <u>Effective Date</u>. The effective date shall be the date upon which this Settlement Agreement is fully executed.
- (19) <u>Modification and Termination</u>. No agreement to modify, amend, extend, supersede, terminate, or discharge this Settlement Agreement, or any portion thereof, is valid or enforceable unless it is in writing and signed by all Parties to this Settlement Agreement.
- (20) <u>Severability</u>. Each provision of this Settlement Agreement is severable, and in the event that any provision of this Settlement Agreement is held to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable in any jurisdiction, the remainder of this Settlement Agreement remains in full force and effect.
- (21) <u>Choice of Law</u>. This Settlement Agreement shall be interpreted and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of California, without regard to California's choice-of-law rules.
- (22) <u>Non-Discharge</u>. It is further agreed that the penalties described in this Settlement Agreement are non-dischargeable under United States Code, title 11, section 523(a)(7), which provides an exception from discharge for any debt to the extent such debt is for a fine, penalty, or forfeiture payable to and for the benefit of a governmental unit.
- (23) <u>Rules of Construction</u>. Any rule of construction to the effect that ambiguities are to be resolved against the drafting party shall not be applied in interpreting this Settlement Agreement.
- (24) <u>Non-Waiver</u>. The failure to enforce any provision of this Settlement Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver of any such provision, nor prevent such Party thereafter from enforcing such provision or any other provision of this Settlement Agreement. The rights and remedies granted all Parties herein are cumulative and the election of one right or remedy by a Party shall not constitute a waiver of such

- Party's right to assert all other legal remedies available under this Settlement Agreement or otherwise provided by law.
- (25) Intent to be Bound. The Parties represent that: They have participated fully in the review and drafting of this Settlement Agreement; understand and accept all terms; enter into this Settlement Agreement freely and voluntarily; have had an opportunity to consult with legal counsel; are fully informed of the terms and effect of this Settlement Agreement; have agreed to this Settlement Agreement after independent investigation and agree it was not arrived at through fraud, duress, or undue influence; and knowingly and voluntarily intend to be legally bound by this Settlement Agreement.
- (26) <u>Venue</u>. The Superior Court of California, located in the County of Sacramento, shall hear any dispute between the Parties arising from this Settlement Agreement.
- (27) <u>Counterparts and Electronic Signatures</u>. This Settlement Agreement may be executed in counterparts. Electronic, facsimile or photocopied signatures shall be considered as valid signatures.
- (28) <u>Release</u>. In consideration of full payment of the civil penalty, and all other undertakings above, CARB hereby releases Expo Furniture and its principals, officers, receivers, trustees, successors and assignees, subsidiary and parent corporations, from any claims CARB may have based on the circumstances described in all paragraphs contained in the Case Background above.
- (29) <u>Authority</u>. The undersigned represents that he or she has full authority to enter into this Settlement Agreement.

#### **PENALTY BASIS**

- (30) <u>Per Unit Penalty</u>. The per unit penalty in this case is a maximum of eleven thousand seven hundred ten dollars (\$11,710.00 USD) per unit per day under Health and Safety Code section 39674, for violations of the Composite Wood Regulation. The penalty of \$6,000.00 USD in this case is for six days of violation. The penalty per day is approximately \$1,000.00 USD.
- (31) <u>Aggravating and Mitigating Factors</u>. The penalties in this matter were determined in consideration of all relevant circumstances, including statutory factors as described in CARB's Enforcement Policy. CARB considered whether the violator came into compliance quickly and cooperated with the investigation; the extent of harm to public health, safety and welfare; nature and persistence of the violation, including the magnitude of the excess emissions; compliance history; preventative efforts taken; innovative nature and the magnitude of the effort required to comply, and the accuracy, reproducibility, and repeatability of the available test

methods; efforts to attain, or provide for, compliance prior to violation; action taken to mitigate the violation; financial burden to the violator; and voluntary disclosure. The penalties are set at levels sufficient to deter violations, to remove any economic benefit or unfair advantage from noncompliance, to obtain swift compliance, and the potential costs, risks, and uncertainty associated with litigation. Penalties in future cases might be smaller or larger depending on the unique circumstances of the case.

- (32) <u>Confidential Business Information</u>. CARB may have based this penalty in part on confidential business information provided by Expo Furniture or confidential settlement communications.
- (33) Effect of Settlement/Reservation of Rights. The following shall apply:
  - (a) This Settlement Agreement resolves the civil claims of CARB for the violations alleged in this Settlement Agreement.
  - (b) CARB reserves, and this Settlement Agreement is without prejudice to, all claims, rights, and remedies against Expo Furniture with respect to all matters not expressly resolved in this Settlement Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of the Settlement Agreement, CARB reserves all claims, rights, and remedies, whether in law or equity, against Expo Furniture with respect to:
    - (i) Noncompliance with or enforcement of any provision of this Settlement Agreement.
    - (ii) Facts that were not disclosed by Expo Furniture to CARB.
    - (iii) Violation of the California Health and Safety Code and its implementing regulations, or other State laws, regulations, or permit condition(s) not expressly resolved in this Settlement Agreement.
    - (iv) Any imminent and substantial endangerment to the public health, welfare, or the environment in California, whether related to the violations addressed in this Settlement Agreement or otherwise.
    - (v) Any criminal liability.
    - (vi) Any claim(s) of any officer or agency of the United States or California, other than CARB.
  - (c) In any subsequent administrative or judicial proceeding initiated by CARB for injunctive relief, civil penalties, or other appropriate relief relating to enforcement of the Settlement Agreement, Expo Furniture shall not assert,

and may not maintain, any defense or claim based upon the principles of waiver, res judicata, collateral estoppel, issue preclusion, claim preclusion, claim-splitting, or other defenses based upon any contention that the claims raised by CARB in the subsequent proceeding were or should have been brought in the instant case.

- (d) This Settlement Agreement does not limit or affect the rights of Expo Furniture or of CARB against any third parties not covered by this Settlement Agreement, nor does it limit the rights of third parties not covered by this Settlement Agreement against Expo Furniture, except as otherwise provided by law. This Settlement Agreement shall not be construed to create rights in, or grant any cause of action to, any third party not covered by this Settlement Agreement.
- (e) This Settlement Agreement is not a permit, or a modification of any permit, under any federal, State, or local laws or regulations. Expo Furniture is responsible for achieving and maintaining compliance with all applicable federal, State, and local laws, regulations, and permits; Expo Furniture's compliance with this Settlement Agreement shall not be a defense to any action commenced pursuant to any such laws, regulations, or permits. CARB does not, by its execution of this Settlement Agreement, warrant or aver in any manner that Expo Furniture's compliance with any aspect of this Settlement Agreement will result in compliance with any provisions of federal, State, or local laws, regulations, or permits.
