Standard vs. Enhanced Certification for New Zero-Emission Heavy-Duty Vehicles March 2024



ENHANCED VS. STANDARD APPLICATIONS HEAVY-DUTY VEHICLE GREENHOUSE GAS CERTIFICATION

Manufacturers of <u>new</u> heavy-duty zero-emission vehicle (ZEV) have the option of applying for an *enhanced* vehicle Executive Order (EO) or a *standard* vehicle EO. New HD ZEVs <u>must</u> obtain a vehicle EO before vehicles are introduced into to commerce in California

The enhanced vehicle EO requires a certified zero-emission powertrain (ZEP), which is a separate EO that must be obtained prior to the enhanced vehicle EO. An enhanced application requires the submittal of additional documentation compared to a standard application.



PATH 1: Enhanced Vehicle EO

STEP 1

- A. Certify your ZEP families per the <u>CA ZEP Test Procedures</u>. Refer to: <u>ZEP Family Naming Convention (Mailout ECC #2020-04)</u> ZEP Certification Checklist
- B. Or, use an already-certified ZEP by a different manufacturer

STEP 2

A. Certify your ZEV families using enhanced certification requirements. Refer to: <u>GHG Certification Checklist</u> California Test Procedures - search "Enhanced" for additional requirements

Note: the ZEP EO must be issued prior to the enhanced vehicle EO. However, both applications can be submitted to CARB simultaneously.

PATH 2: Standard Vehicle EO

Certify your vehicle families using the standard Phase 2 GHG certification procedure. Refer to:

Note: you can still apply for a standard vehicle EO after obtaining a ZEP EO, but you cannot apply for an enhanced EO after obtaining a standard EO (for the same vehicle family).



BENEFITS TO ZEP CERTIFICATION:

- **1.** Eligibility for <u>HVIP funding</u> with ZEP EO. A vehicle EO will also be required.
- 2. Eligibility for criteria ABT credits with ZEP EO starting MY 2024:
 - <u>California Exhaust Emission Standards and Test Procedures for 2004 and</u> <u>Subsequent Model Heavy-Duty Diesel Engines and Vehicles, Section 15.B.3.j</u>
 - Can be banked for use through 2026

BENEFITS TO ENHANCED CERTIFICATION:

1. Advanced Clean Truck (ACT)

- Beginning MY 2024, enhanced certification is required to receive ZEV credit per the <u>Advanced Clean Trucks</u> regulation (see regulation for applicability)
- Low-volume manufacturers, as defined by the ACT regulation, are exempt
- 2. . Zero-Emission Airport Shuttle (ZEAS) Regulations
 - For airport shuttle fleets to comply with ZEAS percentage requirements, 2026 and later model year heavy-duty ZEVs must be certified to the Enhanced Procedures to count towards ZEAS fleet percentage compliance
