Executive Order B-10-11 can no longer be cited alone since Gov Brown is no longer in office. The reference has to be to current Gov Newsom's Executive Order N-15-19. Even though Newsom appended B-10-11 to his EO N-15-19, the legal reference has to be to N-15-19, not B-10-11. Once a governor leaves office, all executive orders issued by that governor are no longer in effect. EOs are policy dictates not statute or law as they only apply to the executive branch of government reporting to the chief executive. Since CARB is a part of the executive branch, then they are bound to follow any policy statements/orders issued by the chief executive/governor to whom they report - in this case Gov Newsom.
