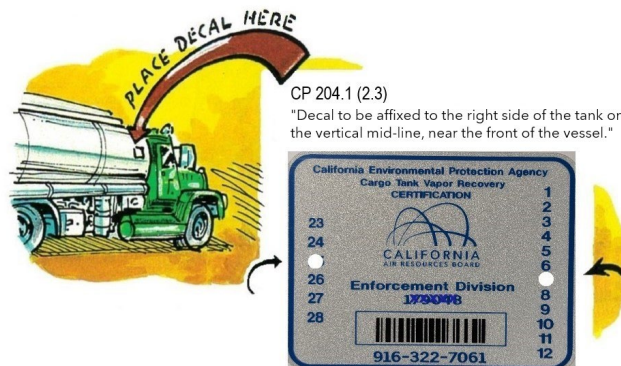


Cargo Tank Certification Decal and Tank Number Display Requirements Mandatory for California Operations

The **Cargo Tank Vapor Recovery Program** is responsible for ensuring the reduction of Volatile Organic Compound (VOC) emissions from gasoline cargo tanks. A Cargo Tank is any container, including associated pipes and fittings, that is used for the transportation of gasoline on any highway and is required to be certified in accordance with Section 41962 of the California Health and Safety Code. The owner and/or operator of a cargo tank operating in California are responsible for complying with the requirements of the Cargo Tank Vapor Recovery Program*, including the requirement to affix the Certification Decal and Cargo Tank Number on the cargo tank

1. **Certification Decal.** The certification decal should be affixed to the right side of the cargo tank on the vertical mid-line, near the front of the vessel. (CP 204.1 (2.3))



2. **Cargo Tank Number.** The CARB-issued Cargo Tank Number for the vessel should be displayed on the cargo tank in a location that can be visible. (CP 204.1 (2.3)). The preferred location is on the left side of the tank, either stamped on the first tank mount or as a vinyl numerical decal on the vertical mid-line near the front.



Failure to comply with these requirements may result in enforcement action.
