


- Click the globe icon located at the bottom of the screen

Status of HVIP Funding

- HIVP is currently fully subscribed but we expect returned funds from cancelled vouchers to be available in the third quarter of 2025.
- The FY2024-25 Implementation Manual shall be released at least 45 days prior to HVIP relaunch of unredeemed returned funds.



Expanding Fleet Eligibility

- In November 2024, the Board approved removing eligibility for private fleets with 50 and more heavy-duty vehicles.
- However, due to recent changes in the market and regulatory environment, a policy shift to reintroduce eligibility to fleets of all sizes is warranted.



Improved Flexibility and Equity for All Fleet Sizes

- Reopen eligibility to all fleet sizes.
- Remove other large fleet restrictions such as voucher reductions and bulk fleet requirements.
- Introduce a rolling cap of up to 20 vouchers per fleet in an unredeemed state at any given time.
 - Small Fleets increased incentive lifetime limit of 5 trucks.
- Pilot on voucher certificate process; direct to fleet for Class 2b vehicles.
- Increase incentive amount for zero-emission conversion kits, 75% of base voucher.



Proposed Changes to Voucher Amounts

- It is critical that HVIP maximizes funding and amplifies its impact on the ZEV marketplace with scale and recognizes the needs of small and large fleets.
- Staff is proposing a simplified two-tier voucher table.
 - Replaces the complex plus-up structure currently used.
 - Simplifies voucher amount calculation.
 - Maintains equity and reflects dynamics of vehicle market pricing.

CORE Voucher Funds

- Over 3,000 pieces of Heavy-Duty equipment funded
- Over 700 businesses/fleets participated
- 70% of funds have gone to Priority Populations
- In 2024, CORE funded 1,193 pieces of zero-emission Heavy-Duty equipment
- Continue to provide zero-emission off-road incentives in 2025



CORE Heavy-Duty Off-Road Categories

Board approved FY2024-25 \$14.97 million allocation from AQIP.

- Category 1:
 - Construction and Agricultural Equipment
- Category 2:
 - Transport Refrigeration Units (TRU); Large forklifts; Cargo Handling Equipment (CHE); Railcar Movers/Locomotives
- Category 3:
 - Mobile Power Units (MPU); Airport Ground Support Equipment
- Category 4:
 - Commercial Harbor Craft (CHC)



CORE Heavy-Duty Updates

- Graduated Terminal Tractors
- Directed FY2024-25 funding to support small businesses and public agencies
- Adjusted large forklift voucher cap up to \$1 million
- Restructured equipment eligibility portions to streamline application process



CORE Heavy-Duty Updates:Heavy Terminal Tractors

The FY 2024-25 Funding Plan states that:

"CARB may consider retaining eligibility for higher weight capacity terminal tractors which are used at ports and intermodal rail yards."



CORE Implementation Manual Improvements

- 3-Month Application Window
- Changes for Rental/Leasing Companies
- Addition of Narrow-Body Aircraft Tugs
- Removing the Annual User Experience Report Requirement
- Removing # of employees from small business definition
- Requiring redemption documentation be submitted by the voucher expiration date
