III. How Grant is Being Utilized

For Year 6, the District elected to improve its ability to perform media releases and provide air quality advisories; to implement a community air sensor project; to sponsor and attend a community outreach event; expand access to District programs for Spanish language constituents; and to facilitate emissions data collection. The NSCAPCD was not selected by CARB for a community project, nor does it have a disadvantaged community.

IV. Summary of Work Completed

- 1. Media Release Project. There is a general expectation by the public that air districts will provide media releases and advisories during wildfire and significant air quality events, and broadly announce grants and incentives programs. This is challenging as media points of contact (POC) change often and simply establishing and maintaining a relevant and current list of print, online, television, radio, and multi-lingual media contacts is difficult and time consuming. For this project, the District licensed "Meltwater" a media platform that maintains current media POCs based on geography, and by topic(s) across all media platforms and languages and includes a mail tool for sending out the media messages and air quality advisories.
- 2. Community Air Monitoring project. The District deployed three "Clarity" brand PM-2.5 sensors with meteorological equipment alongside the District's three PM-10 monitors. These three sites cover the populated communities of the District: Healdsburg, Guerneville, and Cloverdale. These sensors are more robust than the Purple Air brand sensors in that they are specifically calibrated to a location and do not rely on outlet power to remain operable and to collect data, which is very useful during wildfire events when power is shutdown. The Clarity sensors are paired with meteorological equipment that provides pollution wind roses that measure the concentration and direction that PM-2.5 pollution comes from in real time. These (3) sensors are now available on the airnow.gov and fire.airnow.gov sites, which is a new option for Clarity sensors. These instruments and their software tools help the District forecast smoke events, create air quality advisories, determine permissible burn days, and create long term PM-2.5 trends to assist with District planning and rulemaking activities. For this project, the NSCAPCD provided 50% match funds for the sensors.

- 3. <u>Community Outreach Event</u> (January 12, 2024). Guided by a core tenet of the AB 617 CAP Program, and under direction from the District Board, the NSCAPCD sponsored and participated in a public Earth Day event to provide public information about District programs and to highlight what the District does; provide (bilingual) information about AQI; include displays of a monitor and sensor; and to promote the District's community sensor program. Three District employees attended the event at the District booth, including a multi-lingual District employee.
- 4. <u>Translation Projects</u>. As part of this grant funding, the District is having key District documents and materials professionally translated to create Spanish language versions. After English, Spanish is the second most prevalent language in Sonoma County. These translations engender community engagement and access to District programs and incentives and assist with compliance of Open Burn permit and District rules. These translations were performed and funded in three "batches" as follows:
 - o Batch #1 project was translated August 9, 2024 (\$40.00), to create a large format bilingual directory sign for the District office entrance to assist guests.
 - Batch #2 documents were translated November 14, 2024 (\$686.60), and include the CAP Mini Grant Program <u>application and funding contract</u> that currently resides in the "<u>Incentives</u>" section of the District's web site.
 - Batch #3 documents were translated March 3, 2025 (\$349.00), and include the translated <u>Open Burn Program Introduction and Checklist</u> and <u>Open Burn Permit</u> that currently reside in the "<u>Open Burn Permits</u>" section of the District's web site.
- 5. Community Emissions Data Collection. A pillar of the AB 617 Program is the collection of, and community access to, emissions data from permitted facilities. Pursuant to CARB's Criteria and Toxics Reporting Rule (CTR), permitted facilities must submit annual emissions reports to CARB through their local air district to CARB's "EMPI" system, a publicly accessible emissions data repository and query tool. Somewhat unique to NSCAPCD, it is in attainment for all state and federal ambient air quality standards and its minor sources have not previously had systematic annual reporting requirements. Furthermore, CTR requires specific facility and equipment information not typically contained in a permit. This required a comprehensive outreach campaign to help educate and assist approximately 166 applicable first-time small business reporters.

CTR "phases" in minor sources with the first phase reporting due August 1, 2025. To help CARB and industry to be successful, the NSCAPCD crafted and mailed an initial introduction to CTR letter with a custom-made reporting form and a second reminder, or final notice, letter. For the initial letter campaign, 166 businesses were included (\$656.21) and for the follow-up/final letter campaign 57 businesses were included (\$288.14). In conjunction with this outreach effort, NSCAPCD also conducted extensive phone call outreach for follow-up and technical support to finalize the reporting data for the Phase-1 reports. NSCAPCD was able to collect the information and submit the data set to CARB by the August 1, 2025, Phase-1 CTR deadline. Of note, a portion of these expenditures in the amount of \$266.90 was paid with Year 6 funds, which liquidated the balance of the grant funds.

Community Engagement. District outreach for these community programs are supported through the District web site, mailing lists, and social media accounts. The District was a sponsor and booth participant at the 2024 Earth Day event attended by approximately 4,000 people. Public participation has also occurred at General Board meetings with specific requests for District support and funding of local air pollution reduction initiatives. Program input has been provided on an ongoing basis by the Sonoma County Department of Emergency Management, Sonoma County Health Department, Communities Organized to Prepare for Emergencies (COPE), the District web site, and other community feedback. The District has a permanent section on its web site for CAP at https://nosocoair.org/about/activities/. Furthermore, community engagement was enhanced by translating documents for District incentive and permit programs and with an outreach campaign to provide education and to collect emissions data from small businesses required to report in Phase-1 of CARB's Criteria and Toxics Reporting rule by August 1, 2025.

V. Grant Funds Remaining and Expended

The total grant funding amount for Year 6 is \$15,430 and the District expended all these funds by July 18, 2025, well before the June 30, 2027 liquidation deadline, as follows (and as outlined in the table above): \$9,000 for media outreach project; \$4,087.50 for community sensor project; \$1,000 for community outreach event; \$1,075.60 for professional English to Spanish translations; and \$266.90 for emissions data collection. Of note, no jobs were created with these CAPP funds and NSCAPCD population is less than 50,000 people.


