III.	How is grant being utilized to meet goals of AB 617: <i>(If applicable, include emissions reductions being achieved)</i>
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The AB617 Community Air Protection Grant is being utilized to meet the objectives of AB 617. This has been achieved by identifying locations for community air monitors, deploying these monitors, and maintaining both new and existing low-cost air sensor networks along with the FEM network. The District has created a GIS-based spatial database of complaint locations related to illegal burns and other air quality emissions issues. Additionally, a GIS database of emission sources within 1.25 miles of disadvantaged communities identified in SB 535 Disadvantaged Communities 2022 map (Census Tracts and Tribal Areas) has been created. District Staff Also Participated in Community Health Assessment Advisory Committee meetings with county stakeholders.

IV.	Summary of work completed and in progress since the last progress report:
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The district has identified, deployed, and maintained community air monitors and sensor networks. The District has created GIS databases to track complaints about air quality issues, such as illegal burns, and to map emission sources near disadvantaged communities identified by SB 535 Disadvantaged Communities 2022 map (Census Tracts and Tribal Areas). District Staff also participated with Community Health Assessment Advisory Committee meetings with county stakeholders.
