Background

Annual Funding Plan: The annual funding plan is each year's blueprint for expending Low Carbon Transportation and AQIP funds appropriated to CARB in

the State budget. The plan describes CARB's policy drivers and vision for advanced technology mobile source investments, eligible project categories and criteria, project funding allocations, program implementation details, and the justification for these investments.

Carl Moyer Memorial Air Quality Standards Attainment Program (Carl Moyer Program): The Carl Moyer Program is a statewide, locally-directed program that replaces older, high-polluting engines with cleaner-than-required alternatives. Emission reductions funded through the Carl Moyer Program must be in support of the State Implementation Plan (SIP) by being permanent, surplus, quantifiable, and enforceable. In addition, Carl Moyer Program projects (except infrastructure) are required to be cost-effective, by paying a maximum dollar amount per weighted ton of pollution reduced. Staff propose for Board consideration amendments to the Carl Moyer Program cost-effectiveness limits, including the optional limits for off-road zero-emission technologies.
