PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE DESIGNATION CRITERIA

Current Designation Criteria

- Defines attainment and nonattainment
- Lists affected pollutants
- Establishes data requirements
- Distinguishes between regional and more localized pollutants

Defines Designation Categories

- Nonattainment
- Nonattainment-Transitional
- Attainment
- Unclassified

Lists Affected Pollutants

Ozone
PM10
Sulfur Dioxide
Lead
Visibility Reducing
Particles

Carbon Monoxide Nitrogen Dioxide Sulfates Hydrogen Sulfide

New this year: PM2.5

Establishes Data Requirements

- Overall representativeness
- Three-year window
- Reflect averaging time of State standard
- Reflect season of high concentration

Size of Designated Area

- Air Basin: Ozone, NO₂, PM10, sulfates, and visibility reducing particles
- County: CO, SO₂, lead, & H₂S
- Smaller areas if justified

Proposed Amendments to Designation Criteria

- Add PM2.5 to list of regional pollutants
- Clarifications
 - Procedures for evaluating representative and complete data
 - Other minor changes

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE AREA DESIGNATIONS

Proposed 2003 Area Designations for State Standards

- PM2.5
- Ozone
- Carbon Monoxide
- Sulfates

Revisions to State PM Standards

- June 2002 Board Action
 - Adopted new annual PM2.5 standard
 - Revised existing annual PM10 standard
 - Approved expanded list of PM monitors, including continuous monitors

NATIONAL PM2.5 DESIGNATIONS

National PM2.5 Standards Implementation

- US EPA expected to issue final designations by December 2004
- SIPs due three years later 2007
- Attainment deadlines 2009-2014
