Regulatory Overview

- Regulation Required by H&S 43105.5
- Ensures access to dealership quality tools and service information
- Applies to 1994 and Later OBD equipped vehicles
- Access to information over Internet required

January Board Action

- Approved amendments for adoption
 - Light-duty vehicles: low cost tool requirement for immobilizer initialization
 - applicability of reg extended to heavy-duty vehicles
- Staff directed to report back on:
 - immobilizer solution for computer remanufacturers
 - Heavy-duty manufacturers' liability with respect to tools availability
- Record kept open pending consideration of HD OBD item (EMD)

Is There a Better Solution for Computer Remanufacturers?

- Stakeholders meeting April 21
- Remanufacturers presented vehicle software change proposal
- Vehicle manufacturers maintain favor for solution based on adaptation of immobilizer service procedures.

Staff Analysis

- Either solution is feasible and shouldn't cause major cost / business process impacts
- Staff maintains that service procedures solution is best regulatory approach
 - It can be applied to existing and future vehicles at reasonable costs
 - Doesn't conflict with legislative intent
 - Doesn't raise new security concerns

Lead Time for Low Cost Immobilizer Service Tools

- Honda requested lead time through 2009 for low cost service tools requirement (2007 currently)
- Honda still working with staff, U.S. EPA, and aftermarket to address interim solution concerns
- Outcome of discussion can be handled through 15 day change process if necessary

Are Manufacturers Liable for Misuse of Service Tools and Related Information?

- Light-duty industry uses indemnity / hold harmless agreements
- Safeguards put in vehicle / engine computer to avoid problems
- Staff believes more lead time for HD industry is necessary to add safeguards
 - Delay bi-directional control/reprogramming info and tools requirements until 2010
 - Data stream information can be safely provided by 2007 MY
