2005 Legislative Session *Summary*

- Over 2,900 bills introduced
- 145 air quality bills
- 26 air quality bills signed

State Budget Bills



Hydrogen Highway

SB 76 - Budget Trailer Bill

- Originally ARB sponsored SB 250, Campbell
- Appropriates \$6.5 million for:
 - 3 hydrogen fueling stations
 - lease of 12 hydrogen vehicles
 - purchase of 2 internal combustion H2 vehicles
- Projects must contribute to:
 - achieving 30% GHG reduction
 - using 33% renewable sources
 - result in no additional emissions

School Bus Funding

SB 77, Budget Bill

- \$25 million appropriation
 - \$12.5 for replacement of pre-1977 buses
 - \$12.5 for retrofits
- Results in approximately 100 replacements and 1,000 retrofits

Alternative Fuels

AB 1007, Pavley

- Qualitative analysis of transportation fuels
- Requires CEC and ARB to:
 - assess relative environmental and public health benefits of different fuel types
 - develop a plan by July 2007 to increase use of alternative fuels
 - set goals for 2012, 2017, and 2022

GHG Labeling

AB 1229, Nation

- Add GHG information to existing smog label
- ARB must adopt by July 2007
- New labels on 2009 model year vehicles

Bay Area Motor Vehicle Fees

AB 694, Chan

- Bay Area gains same authority as other districts
- Allows private entities to receive funds
- Expands the list of eligible projects



Fine PM Monitors

AB 841, Arambula

- Requires SJVAPCD to install a fine PM (2.5) monitor on west side of Fresno County
- Must be placed in a low income area



Oceangoing Ships

SB 771, Simitian

- Bans waste incineration by ships within 3 miles of coast
- Also regulates release of graywater, sewage, sewage sludge, oily bilgewater, hazardous waste, or other waste

Ports and Goods Movement

- Governor's Goods Movement Working Group and Goods Movement Action Plan
- Mayor Hahn's No Net Increase task force
- Marine and Intermodal Transportation System Advisory Council
- Legislation

Ports and Goods Movement *Administration Actions*

- Goods Movement Action Plan
 - complete by mid December 2005
 - define infrastructure improvements
 - identify measures to reduce pollution
 - identify options for funding
- Action Plan Goals
 - cut emissions to 2001 levels by 2010
 - continue reductions to meet attainment
 - reduce diesel risk 85% by 2020

Locomotive Remote Sensing

AB 1222, Jones

- Part of ARB MOU
- Locomotive remote sensing pilot program
- Advisory Group
- Codifies SCAQMD and railroad agreement to fund evaluation - \$500,000
- Report to Legislature – Due December 2006

Rail Mitigation Fee

SB 459, Romero

- SCAQMD railroad fee
- Opposed by ARB:
 - preempted by federal law
 - could have terminated 1998 MOU
risking 24 tpd of NO_x reductions
