Investment Decisions Coordinated Across All Programs

- Funds transformative technologies and transportation equity
- Encourage turnover of fleets to cleanest commercialized technologies
- Comprehensive and balanced portfolio of available investments that maximizes criteria pollutant and greenhouse gas emission reductions

3-Year Investment Strategies for Light-Duty and Heavy-Duty

- Provide direction and identify needed investment areas for future Funding Plans
- Light-Duty Plan addresses projected needs for CVRP and transportation equity projects
- Heavy-Duty Plan builds on guiding principles from FY 2017-18 Funding Plan, including beachhead concept
- Highlight potential future projects



Addressing Additional Barriers to Adopting Advanced Technology

- Cost is only one barrier to adoption
 - Low NOx natural gas vehicles
 - Battery electric vehicles
 - Fuel cells vehicles
- Other barriers have been identified:
 - Information and Outreach
 - Infrastructure
 - Job training
 - Secondary markets
 - Others
- Establishing a group to focus on barriers and ways to overcome them



Funding Plan Priorities

- Support long-term transformation of fleets to zero-emission
- Build on successes of previous investments and incorporate lessons learned
- Support implementation of SB 350 recommendations by increasing access to clean transportation and mobility options
- Design investments that benefit AB 1550 priority populations

Staff proposes increasing AB 1550 target to 50 percent


Updates on Current Projects



Building a Sustainable Light-Duty Market

- Over 250,000 CVRP rebates
- Over 5 percent of CA new car sales
- Over \$35 million in rebates issued to low-income consumers







Building on Transportation Equity Investments

- Los Angeles and Sacramento car share projects launched; five more underway
- Statewide financing assistance pilot launched
- 3,700+ cars scrapped and replaced
- 40 school buses for rural districts





Building a Sustainable Heavy-Duty Market

- ~5,000 HVIP/low NOx vouchers
- Over 1,000 participating fleets
- Over 25 manufacturers and
 90 eligible models



- Class 8 electric trucks now available
- Over 3,000 trucks and buses in disadvantaged and low-income communities





Supporting a Clean Transit Future

 Under HVIP, typical transit buses vouchers are \$180,000 (up to \$315,000)

Overall funding portfolio projected to meet current transit demand

Funding also available in VW
 Mitigation, Carl Moyer, and AB 617

Full eligibility until at least
 2023/2025



Building on Heavy-Duty Freight Investments

- Supports the Sustainable Freight Action Plan
- Demonstrations of advanced technology trucks and freight equipment
- Pilots of advanced technology trucks
- Zero-emission off-road freight voucher project launching soon

Fiscal Year 2018-19 Funding Plan

A Closer Look at Funding This Year



\$455 Million Low Carbon Transportation Appropriation

- \$200 million for CVRP
 - \$175 million for standard rebates
 - \$25 million for increased rebates for low-income consumers
- \$75 million for transportation equity projects
- \$125 million for HVIP clean truck & bus vouchers
- \$55 million for advanced technology freight equipment



Air Quality Improvement Program

- \$28.64 million AQIP
 - For criteria pollutant and toxics focused mobile source projects
 - Focus on reducing legacy fleet emissions
 - Truck Loan Assistance Program
 - Truck Filter Replacements (NEW)

Highlights of Light-Duty Vehicle Proposal

- Meet anticipated CVRP demand
- Ensure continuous funding for low-income applicants
- Increase awareness and accessibility of incentives
- Continue critical outreach to consumers and dealerships in priority populations



Highlights of Transportation Equity Investments Proposal

- Addresses community-specific needs
- Expands and adapts existing transportation equity projects
- Shared goals with AB 617 Community Air Protection Program
- Holistic approach to increase access and awareness
- Promotes cleaner transportation for all Californians
- Project complexity has led to longer timelines to launch




Clean Mobility in Schools Pilot - NEW

- Multi-faceted mobility grant to reduce emissions and transform school transportation
- Showcase broad range of clean mobility options in K-12 schools in disadvantaged communities
- Pilot for eventual replication statewide





Proposed Project Allocations: Heavy-Duty Vehicles and Off-Road Equipment



Highlights of HVIP Proposal

 Meet anticipated demand for all technologies (zero-emission, hybrid, low NOx)



- Revise some voucher amounts to better reflect incremental cost
- Proposed modification: add low NOx new purchase vouchers for diesel refuse fleets



Highlights of Freight Proposal

- Approved by board in 2017, preliminary awards announced September 2018
- \$55 million for Fiscal Year 2018-19
 - Would bring total available for projects to \$205 million
- Use 2018-19 allocation to support selected projects
- Consistent with priority projects identified in 3-Year Investment Strategy





Truck Loan Assistance Program

- ~ \$100 million State contribution to date, leveraged to provide about \$1.2 billion in financing
- Meets demand for Fiscal Year 2018-19; additional funding needed through 2023



- Will fund about 8,200 new trucks
- Helps truckers to comply with the Truck and Bus Regulation



Diesel Filter Replacement Project - NEW

- Funds filter substrate replacements
- First-come, first-served basis
- Reduces uncontrolled air toxics emissions



 Will fund approximately 270-500 substrate replacements or 150 new filter systems

Conclusion and Recommendation



Staff's Proposal Advances Clean Transportation Access

- Accelerates commercialization of zero-emission technologies to meet climate and air quality goals
- Expands rebate and voucher projects to meet affordability and consumer and fleet demand
- Continues to fund and expand transportation equity projects as needed to meet community needs
