Purpose

To fund community driven efforts through AB 617 to reduce exposure in communities most impacted by air pollution

To develop and implement new community led strategies to measure air pollution and reduce health impacts

Goals

To help awardees deepen their participation in the AB 617 process, as well as to build capacity to become active partners with government and others to identify, evaluate, and ultimately reduce air pollution and exposure to harmful emissions in their communities

Transferability of emissions reduction strategies


Foster workforce development


