



Progress Report on Joint Meeting Interagency Coordination

November 3, 2022

Recap: April 2022 Joint Meeting

- **AB 285 Report and Draft SB 150 Report's Initial Findings:** Both reports find CA is not on track to meet its VMT reduction goals.
- **HCD's initial plans for administering REAP 2.0:** \$600M program will support transformative local and regional planning and implementation.
- **Local and regional input:** Panel of local and regional partners find additional funding tools are needed for SCS implementation.

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- In response to the AB 285/SB 150 initial findings, the joint body requested:
 - CARB, CTC, HCD staff to collaborate to establish potential actions that agencies could take to address these findings
 - CARB, CTC, HCD staff to identify opportunities and challenges associated with those potential actions
- The joint body also identified a need for additional tools to implement regional solutions, and specific measures of equity and well-being

Progress on Joint Meeting Interagency Coordination

Since the April 7 Joint Meeting, staff of CARB, CTC, and HCD collaborated with the Housing + Transportation Coordination Workgroup to:

- Review the AB 285 Report's findings
- Provide feedback to Strategic Growth Council staff, which developed:
 - 72 potential actions,
 - Grouped into eight topic areas (each with opportunities and challenges) (*California Transportation Assessment: Final Report*) (released August 31)

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- CTC also worked with CARB and HCD to develop and adopt SB 1 Competitive Transportation Funding Program Guidelines that address important state policy goals highlighted in the AB 285 and Draft SB 150 reports.
- CARB incorporated feedback into the Draft SB 150 Report, focusing on:
 - Authorizing tools for SCS implementation
 - Expanded reporting on accessibility and mobility metrics
 - Potential actions to support SCS implementation
- HCD and CARB collaborated with OPR to develop REAP 2.0 program guidelines and release NOFAs in August for MPOs and rural counties/tribes.

Upcoming Coordination Efforts

CARB, CTC, and HCD will consider AB 285 potential actions and seek to implement regional and local feedback through:

- Collaborating on CAPTI implementation
- RTP Guidelines update
- CTP Guidelines update
- CARB-HCD-CTC technical consultation and review for SB 1 programs
- HCD-CARB evaluation of REAP 2.0 applications and awards
