## California's Transportation Infrastructure Investments

- Governor's Executive Order N-19-19 directed the California State Transportation Agency (CalSTA) to leverage state transportation spending to meet state climate goals.
- California's state agencies play a role in scoping, recommending, or selecting projects in over \$5 billion in transportation infrastructure funding annually.

- Active Transportation Program (ATP)
- Interregional Transportation Improvement Program (ITIP)
- Local Partnership Program (LPP)
- Solutions for Congested Corridors (SCCP)
- State Highway Operations & Protection Program (SHOPP)
- Trade Corridor Enhancement Program (TCEP)
- Transit & Intercity Rail Capital Program (TIRCP)








## Climate Action Plan for Transportation Infrastructure (CAPTI)

- CAPTI is a holistic framework for aligning state infrastructure investments with climate, health, and equity goals.
- The plan includes 10 Guiding Principles, 8 Strategies, and 34 actions to create a vision and plan for prioritizing state transportation investments.





### **Complementary Parallel Efforts**

### **High Speed Rail**

- High-speed rail will connect state megaregions, enhancing interregional travel and reducing vehicle miles travelled
- Goal of 2030 operation for segment Merced-Bakersfield

### **New Funding Opportunities**

- Historic increases in federal and state funding
- \$5.5 billion in federal formula funds for climate action, equity, rail, transit
- \$13.4 billion state budget for transportation improvements






### Implementation Approach

## **CAPTI Annual Progress Report**

CAPTI Strategy 8 calls for a **CAPTI Annual Report** on implementation progress to be released annually.

#### **Annual Report includes:**

- A status of each action
- Highlights of key successes
- Preliminary discussion of data and metrics

#### Annual Report does not include:

- An update to the CAPTI Framework or strategies
- New actions or removal of existing actions



## **CAPTI Implementation Highlights**

- The CAPTI Annual Report shows the progress made over the past year and a half since the plan was originally adopted.
- The report highlights early successes related to:
  - Program guideline alignment
  - Project programming alignment
  - Stakeholder engagement
  - Allocation of state and federal funding



# Implementation: SB 1 Program Guidelines

- Solutions for Congested Corridors
   Program (SCCP) guidelines and scoring criteria prioritize transit, bike, pedestrian, and vehicle miles travelled reducing highway projects.
- Trade Corridor Enhancement Program (TCEP) guidelines prioritize projects with zero emission infrastructure components.





# Implementation: Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program Guidelines

- Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program (TIRCP)
   Guidelines include:
  - Support for implementation of the California Integrated Travel Project (Cal-ITP)
  - New Clean Fleet/Equipment and Network Improvement project category
- The 2022 Cycle 5 awards will fund 393 zero-emission buses, 51 zero-emission shuttles or microtransit vehicles, 8 new light rail vehicles, 2 zero-emission ferries.



# Implementation: Pro-Housing Program Guidelines

- Pro-housing Designation Program incentivizes local governments to adopt pro-housing policies that reduce VMT by increasing infill development. The program and/or pro-housing principles were incorporated into:
  - Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program
  - Solutions for Congested Corridors
  - Local Partnership Program
- Active Transportation Program guidelines encourage applicants to consider pro-housing principles and apply for the Pro-housing Designation Program.






# Implementation: Interregional Transportation Improvement Program

**Projects** 

 The Interregional Transportation Improvement Program (ITIP) includes 10 new projects, 9 multi-modal and 1 active transportation project.





# Implementation: Equity Advisory Committee

- CalSTA, Caltrans, and the CTC collectively established an Interagency Transportation Equity Advisory Committee.
- The committee will elevate historically marginalized voices in decision-making on transportation planning and funding programs.





## Implementation: Rural Transportation Solutions

- CalSTA and the Rural Counties Task Force held a Sustainable Rural Transportation Solutions Summit this year.
- Summit participants shared best practices for equipping rural communities with the tools to further the vision of the CAPTI framework in rural settings.





# Implementation: Funding Increases

- The Active Transportation Program received an increase of about \$100 million per year in federal funding and a one-time \$1.05 billion increase in state funds to Cycle 6.
- The Highways to Boulevards pilot program received \$150 million in the State Budget for Fiscal Year 2022-23 to leverage the federal investment in the Reconnecting Communities Program.




### **Action Status Overview**

## Tracking Program Outcomes



CalSTA has contracted the Mineta Transportation Institute to develop metrics to track program outcomes through CAPTI implementation.

The study will evaluate projected changes in **emissions**, **economic prosperity**, and **social equity** benefits.



### Program Outcome Metrics

Vehicle miles travelled, greenhouse gas emissions

### **Economic Prosperity**

• Jobs created, income generated, labor market transformations

### Social Equity

 Types of transportation benefits likely to benefit disadvantaged communities
