
#### Staff's Recommendation

- Air District prioritizing early emission reductions in the community and surrounding area










### **Proposed New Community Boundary**


#### Identifying Expanded Focus Area Through Engagement and Collaboration














## Community Air Monitoring Plan Implementation Continues

Portable sensors to monitor PM<sub>2.5</sub>

Black Carbon, speciated PM<sub>2.5</sub>, PM<sub>10</sub>, VOCs

Phase 3:


Portable lab monitoring with regulatory-grade equipment
