

Project Updates



Project Update Regional Clean Cars 4 All Program (CC4A)

- \$165 million for over 20,000 vehicles
- No proposed changes to project criteria
- Shifted \$14 million from Driving Clean Assistance Program to San Joaquin Valley Clean Cars 4 All project













Project Update Zero-Emission Assurance (ZAP)

Assembly Bill 193 (Cervantes, Chapter 363, Statutes of 2018)

Used plug-in hybrid, battery electric, or fuel-cell electric vehicles

Limit: One ZAP incentive per vehicle

Project Update California E-Bike Incentive Project

Incentive amount \$1,750 - \$2,000

Age: ≥ 18 years

Household income* ≤ \$45,180 1-person ≤ \$93,600 4-person Class I, II, & III bikes

Battery certification

Function & safety accessories

Additional education & outreach

Retailer engagement & training

*300% of Federal Poverty Threshold (FPL). Lower requirements for 225% of FPL



Sustainable Community-Based Transportation Equity Incentive Projects Update

Over 100 projects implemented Staff will work to:

- Overcome implementation
 & sustainability challenges
- Provide upfront support
- Improve future grant processes
- Support state areas where funds exhausted
- Refine data process
- Evaluate needs-based models

Total State Budget Appropriation	\$34.94



Proposed Policy Recommendations Innovative Small E-Fleet (ISEF)

Proposed Allocation: \$14.97 million Explore expansion of eligible projects to include:

- Feasibility for used truck incentives
- Insurance, and
- Fleet management assistance





Proposed Policy Recommendations Clean Off-Road Equipment (CORE)

Proposed Allocation: \$14.97 million

Funding for small businesses & public agencies

Graduate zero-emission off-road terminal tractors

Increase forklift incentives




Project Update Zero-Emission Truck Loan Pilot

Proposed Allocation: \$5 million

Increase incentive for conversion kits



New process for Class 2b vouchers



Allow up to five "2x" vouchers for small fleets




Clarify fleet size eligibility



Evaluate future MSRP cap

Policy Recommendation - Driving Clean Assistance Program (DCAP)

 Increase loan cap from \$30,000 to \$45,000 for financing assistance







Comments Received

- Shift prior-year funds from statewide Driving Clean Assistance Program to regional air district Clean Cars 4 All programs
 - Fiscal Year 2022-23 State Budget included "...a minimum of \$125 million to establish the Clean Cars 4 All program statewide".
 - Movement of these funds requires legislative action.
 - Competitively bid & awarded to small, community-based organization with broad partnerships. Program open & operating.
