BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board requests Gene to monitor the view from his Los Angeles home and to notify the Board if his views of the mountains on one side and Catalina Island on the other slip back into the smog, and to send us a good word as his views improve over the years due in large part to regulatory efforts which he helped put in place.
