

## Notice of Decision

- Project Title:** California Certification Procedures for Light-Duty Engine Packages for Use in New Light-Duty Specially-Produced Motor Vehicles for 2019 and Subsequent Model Years
- Project Location:** Statewide
- Public Meeting Date:** October 25, 2018 Agenda Item 18-8-3
- Project Description:** The regulations implements California Certification Procedures for Light-Duty Engine Packages for Use in New Light-Duty Specially-Produced Motor Vehicles for 2019 and Subsequent Model Years to create a process for the certification of a replica car (referred to as a specially-produced motor vehicle or SPMV) in California. A SPMV resembles the body of a motor vehicle that had been commercially manufactured for sale not less than 25 years ago, such as replica versions of the Shelby Cobras and Ford GT40s. The regulation provides two certification paths, one for engine manufacturers, and one for SPMV manufacturers.

This notice is to advise that the California Air Resources Board (CARB) as the lead agency, approved the above regulatory action on October 25, 2018.

The Board found that, on the basis of the whole record, the regulatory action will not result in any significant adverse impacts on the environment. CARB prepared an environmental analysis (EA) in accordance with the requirements of its certified regulatory program under CEQA. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, §15251, subd, (d)). The EA, included in the Staff Report: Initial Statement of Reasons prepared for the proposed rulemaking concluded implementation of the regulatory action would not result in any significant adverse environmental impacts. Mitigation measures were not made a condition of approval, and findings and a statement of overriding considerations were not adopted for this regulatory action.

No written comments received during the 45-day comment period raised any significant environmental issues pertaining to this regulatory action.
