# Notice of Public Meeting to Consider PM2.5 Area Designation Recommendations for the Revised Federal Annual PM2.5 Standard

The California Air Resources Board (CARB or Board) will conduct a public meeting at the date and time noted below to consider adopting staff recommendations for nonattainment areas for the 2024 Revised Annual fine particulate matter (PM2.5) National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS or standard) to be submitted to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA).

This public meeting may continue at 9:00 a.m., on January 24, 2025. #### **Background**

The Clean Air Act requires U.S. EPA to set health-based air quality standards for particulate matter and other criteria pollutants. On February 7, 2024, U.S. EPA strengthened the annual PM2.5 standard from 12.0 micrograms per cubic meter (μg/m³) to 9.0 μg/m³. The Clean Air Act requires states to submit nonattainment area recommendations to U.S. EPA within one year of U.S. EPA establishing a new standard and for this standard, that deadline is February 7, 2025. The nonattainment area recommendations are based on 2021-2023 PM<sub>2.5</sub> air quality monitoring data and include boundary descriptions.

U.S. EPA plans to designate nonattainment areas for the 9.0 µg/m³ annual PM2.5 standard by February 6, 2026. U.S. EPA will base these final designations on the latest available air quality monitoring data which at that time will be the years 2022-2024. State implementation plans will be due 18 months after the effective date of designations, with attainment required at the end of the calendar year six years after designations, unless an area is reclassified to Serious.

#### **Proposed Action**

CARB staff recommend that the following areas be designated as nonattainment for the 9.0 µg/m³ annual PM2.5 standard: portion of Plumas County, portion of Mendocino County, portion of Feather River Air Quality Management District, San Francisco Bay Area Air Basin, Sacramento County, San Joaquin Valley Air Basin, South Coast Air Basin, San Diego County, and portion of Imperial County.
