LARGE CONFINED ANIMAL FACILITY

Pursuant to your findings in review of the above-referenced rulemaking, the Air Resources Board (ARB) hereby authorizes you to correct the rulemaking record as follows:

1. Substitute the attached revised "Final Regulation Order" behind each copy of the STD. Form 400 (seven copies provided), which contains a change to section 86501, reporting requirement date. January 1, 2006 is a past date so we can not reasonable expect people to comply with the reporting requirement, therefore we are replacing with July 1, 2006. We are not using the regulation effective date because July 1, 2006 would be a more recognizable date.
2. Behind tab 14 add the attached references that were inadvertently left out of the record.
