Background

The California Health and Safety Code (HSC), Sections 39700-39705, established ARB's research program. It directed the Board to coordinate and administer all air pollution research that is funded, to any extent, with State funds. To facilitate this process, HSC Section 39705 directs the Board to appoint a Research Screening Committee to give advice and recommendations on all air pollution research projects proposed for funding.

In response to these mandates, staff develops a plan every year for supporting the Board's mission. This year's proposed research is outlined in the report, Proposed Research Plan, Fiscal Year 2017-2018 (Plan). This Plan reflects a concerted effort to identify the highest priority needs of ARB, and the research projects included in this Plan will support attainment of upcoming air quality and greenhouse gas targets. ARB's research program will continue to focus on issues that are unique to California or specific to its vulnerable populations and regions, and to leverage and complement research supported by other funding organizations.

Research included in the Plan will advance the state of the science and support the Air Resources Board's efforts to meet California's air quality and climate goals by evaluating automated technologies in light- and heavy-duty vehicles, developing strategies to reduce exposure to pollution in disadvantaged communities, updating

inventories for short-lived climate pollutants, and assessing novel mitigation strategies in the agricultural sector. Support for California's air quality goals will be realized through research to improve our understanding of atmospheric chemistry and physics and through the measurement of mobile source emissions to verify the effectiveness of light-duty vehicle emission reduction programs.

Proposed Action

ARB staff will present a written report and presentation at the meeting.
