

Re: AB32 Implementation

Dear Ms. Nichols,



It has been brought to my attention that you are currently selecting the appropriate way to implement AB32. It makes us proud that you and our Statewide Elected Officials are proactively engaging on Global Warming and identifying the appropriate ways to combat this problem and protect our communities. I could only image how difficult this process must be for you and your agency, but I am extremely thankful that you are finding the way to protect our environment and communities for generations to come.

I have read up on this issue and there are some concerns that we'd like to share with you. While we support AB 32 and your efforts and we recognize the benefits of reducing greenhouse gas emissions, we wonder what would be the consequences for mandating these large utilities to reduce emissions by the rates indicated in AB32.
