EXECUTIVE ORDER M-1-65-1
Relating to Certification of New Motorcycles

KAWASAKI HEAVY INDUSTRIES, LTD.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Air Resources Board by the Health and Safety Code, Division 26, Part 5, Chapter 2; and

Pursuant to the authority vested in the undersigned by Health and Safety Code Sections 39515 and 39516 and Executive Orders G-45-3 and G-45-4;

IT IS ORDERED AND RESOLVED: That Kawasaki Heavy Industries, Ltd., has submitted its certification plan dated November 21, 1985, to meet the 1.4 grams per kilometer hydrocarbon (HC) exhaust emission standard applied as a corporate average for motorcycles with engine displacements of 280 cubic centimeters or greater. This certification plan shall apply to 1986 model-year motorcycles to be manufactured after February 28, 1985, and contains the provisions for complying with the conditions required by Section 1958(b), Title 13 of the California Administrative Code.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That before offering motorcycles of any engine family for sale, certification of the exhaust emission control system and designated engine family exhaust emission limit, in accordance with the approved certification plan for compliance with the corporate average standard, and the certification of the appropriate evaporative emission family for the 1986 model-year are required.

The Executive Order Supersedes Executive Order M-1-65 previously issued for the certification plan dated June 27, 1985.
