Pursuant to the authority vested in the undersigned by Health and Safety Code Sections 39515 and 39516 and Executive Orders G-45-3 and G-45-4;

IT IS ORDERED AND RESOLVED: That Honda Motor Co., Ltd. has submitted its certification plan dated August 3, 1987 to meet the 1.4 grams per kilometer hydrocarbon (HC) exhaust emission standard applied as a corporate average for motorcycles with engine displacements of 280 cubic centimeters or greater. This certification plan shall apply to 1987 model-year motorcycles and contains the provisions for complying with the conditions required by Section 1958(b), Title 13 of the California Administrative Code.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That before offering motorcycles of any engine family for sale, certification of the exhaust emission control system and designated engine family exhaust emission limit, in accordance with the approved certification plan for compliance with the corporate average standard, and certification of the appropriate evaporative emission family for the 1987 model year is required.

Executive Order M-2-111-2 for the certification plan dated February 26, 1987 is hereby cancelled.




