EXECUTIVE ORDER M-3-122-1  
Relating to Certification of New Motorcycles

YAMAHA MOTOR CO., LTD.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Air Resources Board by the Health and Safety Code, Division 26, Part 5, Chapter 2; and


Pursuant to the authority vested in the undersigned by Health and Safety Code Sections 39515 and 39516 and Executive Orders G-45-3 and G-45-4;

IT IS ORDERED AND RESOLVED: That Yamaha Motor Co., Ltd. has submitted its certification plan dated May 30, 1989 to meet the 1.0 grams per kilometer hydrocarbons (HC) exhaust emission standard applied as a corporate average for motorcycles with engine displacements of 280 to 699 cubic centimeters. This certification plan shall apply to 1990 model-year motorcycles and contains the provisions for complying with the conditions required by Section 1953(b), Title 13 of the California Code of Regulations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That before offering motorcycles of any engine family for sale, certification of the exhaust emission control system and designated engine family exhaust HC emission limit, in accordance with the approved certification plan for compliance with the corporate average standard, and certification of the appropriate evaporative emission family for the 1990 model year is required.

Executive Order M-3-122 for the certification plan dated March 9, 1989 is hereby cancelled.
