## EXECUTIVE ORDER M-16-2-1 Relating to Certification of New Motorcycles

## WESTWARD INDUSTRIES, LTD.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Air Resources Board by the Health and Safety Code, Division 26, Part 5, Chapter 2; and

Pursuant to the authority vested in the undersigned by Health and Safety Code Sections 39515 and 39516 and Executive Orders G-45-3 and G-45-4;

WHEREAS, the Air Resources Board issued Executive Order M-16-2 which certified 1992 model-year Westward Industries, Ltd., exhaust emission control systems as described below for four-stroke gasoline-powered motorcycles:

WHEREAS, Executive Order M-16-2 was granted pursuant to and subject to the "Exhaust Emission Standards and Test Procedures--Motorcycles Manufactured on or after January 1, 1978" as required by Title 13, California Code of Regulations, Section 1958, and the conditions listed in said Executive Order which required the certified vehicles to conform to all applicable California emission regulations.

WHEREAS, Westward Industries, Ltd. has violated the procedures and conditions listed in Executive Order M-16-2 by its failure to submit complete information in its application for certification.

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that Executive Order M-16-2 issued October 28, 1992, is revoked and that Westward Industries, Ltd. cease further introduction into commerce in the State of California those vehicles which have been previously certified under said Executive Order and which were in Westward Industries, Ltd.'s possession as of June 16, 1993, the date Westward Industries, Ltd., was notified of the Air Resources Board's intent to issue this revocation.
