EXECUTIVE ORDER M-2-304-1  
Relating to Certification of New Motorcycles

HONDA MOTOR CO., LTD.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Air Resources Board by the Health and Safety Code, Division 26, Part 5, Chapter 2; and,


Pursuant to the authority vested in the undersigned by Health and Safety Code Sections 39515 and 39516 and Executive Order G-45-9;

IT IS ORDERED AND RESOLVED: That Honda Motor Co., Ltd. has submitted its certification plan dated March 27, 1997, to meet the 1.4 grams per kilometer hydrocarbons (HC) exhaust emission standard applied as a corporate average for motorcycles with engine displacements of 700 cubic centimeters or greater. This certification plan shall apply to 1998 model-year motorcycles and contains the provisions for complying with the conditions required by Section 1958(b), Title 13 of the California Code of Regulations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That before offering motorcycles of any engine family for sale, certification of the exhaust emission control system and designated engine family exhaust HC emission limit, in accordance with the approved certification plan for compliance with the corporate average standard, and certification of the appropriate evaporative emission family for the 1998 model year are required.

Executive Order M-2-304, issued March 18, 1997, is cancelled and replaced by Executive Order M-2-304-1.
