Relating to Approval of New Motor Vehicles

INTERNATIONAL HARVESTER COMPANY

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Air Resources Board by Sections 39150 and 39151 of the Health and Safety Code; and

Pursuant to the authority vested in the undersigned by Section 39023 of the Health and Safety Code and Executive Order G-45-1;

IT IS ORDERED AND RESOLVED: That International Harvester Company 1974 model-year diesel engines in heavy-duty motor vehicles are approved for the engine family described below:

<u>Engine Family</u>	<u>Engine Size CID</u>	<u>Type</u>	<u>Engine Models</u>
D-282	281	Inline-6	85 BHP, 80 BHP

Section 39152, Part I, Division 26 of the California Health and Safety Code requires that the manufacturer affix a decal to the side window to the rear of the driver or, if there is no such window on the driver's side, to the windshield of the motor vehicle.

The following are the recommended values to be listed on the manufacturer's decal:



These values are in effect until the termination of 1974 model-year production.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED AND RESOLVED: That Executive Order A-4-19, dated May 13, 1974, is hereby rescinded.
